This Contract is executed between:

BASES CONVERSION AND DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY, a government instrumentality vested with corporate powers, created by virtue of Republic Act (RA) No. 7227, as amended, with principal office address at the BCDA Corporate Center, 2/F Bonifacio Technology Center, 31st St. corner 2nd Avenue, Bonifacio Global City, Taguig City, Metro Manila, represented herein by its Executive Vice President, AILEEN ANUNCIACION R. ZOSA, who is duly authorized for this purpose under the BCDA's Manual of Approval approved by the BCDA Board of Directors on 22 November 2017, as evidenced by Secretary's Certificate dated 14 March 2018, which is attached hereto as Annex "A", hereinafter called as the "BCDA";

-and-

Dark Horse Security Agency, Inc., a corporation duly organized and existing under the laws of the Republic of the Philippines, with office address at 317 3F Williams Hotel, Timog Avenue, South Triangle, Quezon City, represented herein by its Authorized Representative, **MR. JASPER LLEWELLYN Z. SY** as evidenced by its Secretary's Certificate, a copy of which is attached hereto as **Annex "B"**, hereinafter called as the **"Supplier"**.

BCDA and the Supplier are collectively referred to as the "Parties" and individually as a "Party".

ANTECEDENTS:

On 08 December 2016, BCDA and the Department of Information and Communications Technology (DICT) executed a Framework Agreement to collaborate and jointly undertake the Luzon Bypass Infrastructure (LBI) Project, primarily for the purpose of: (1) constructing, maintaining, and operating the Luzon Bypass Infrastructure (LBI); (2) facilitate the exchange usage of the LBI for connectivity to the rest of the world in an effort to drastically lower the cost of government connectivity; (3) make available a free, ultra-high speed internet connectivity to government users as well as BCDA zones; and (4) consolidate and link various government agencies through a single information network.

The LBI Project is a component of the National Broadband Plan being implemented by DICT, which aims to establish a national backbone to provide connectivity to government offices as one of DICT's vital strategies in building and enhancing digital infrastructure in the Philippines, which includes the National Fiber Backbone Project Phase 1 (NFBP Ph 1).

On 29 December 2020, BCDA and DICT executed a Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) to allow DICT to entrust, set and assign its authority to procure the NFBP Ph 1 and the closely related projects and/or undertakings, to BCDA. BCDA has

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accepted the task, and will be compensated of its services and reimbursed of any costs it may incur in performing its duties under the MOA.

BCDA has conducted a competitive bidding for the procurement of Security Services for the International Cable Landing Stations and Repeater Stations.

The Supplier has been determined to have complied with the eligibility requirements, and is responsive to all the requirements of the Project and the conditions as specified in the bidding documents.

BCDA is desirous that the Supplier execute the **Contract for the Procurement** of Security Services for the International Cable Landing Stations and Repeater Stations and BCDA has accepted the Bid for <u>Seven Million Six Hundred Twenty Three Thousand Four Hundred Eighty Two and 45/100 (Php 7,623,482.45)</u> by the Supplier for the execution and completion of such Services and the remedying of any defects therein.

ACCORDINGLY, the Parties agree as follows:

- 1. In this Contract, words and expressions shall have the same meanings as are respectively assigned to them in the Conditions of Contract hereinafter referred to.
- 2. The following documents shall be attached, deemed to form, and be read and construed as integral part of the Agreement, to wit:
 - a. General Conditions of Contract;
 - b. Special Conditions of Contract;
 - c. Terms of Reference;
 - d. Security Plan;
 - e. Schedule of Requirements;
 - f. Technical Specifications;
 - g. Invitation to bid;
 - h. Instruction to Bidders;
 - i. Bid Data Sheet;
 - j. Addenda and/or Supplemental/Bid Bulletins, if any;
 - k. Bid form, Supplier's Bid, including the Technical and Financial Proposals, and all the documents/statements contained in the Bidder's bidding envelopes, as annexes, and all other documents submitted (e.g., Bidder's response to request for clarifications on the bid), including corrections to the bid, if any, resulting from the BCDA's bid evaluation;
 - 1. Eligibility requirements, documents and/or statements;
 - m. Performance Security;
 - n. Notice of Award of Contract and the Supplier's conforme thereto; and
 - o. Other contract documents that may be required by existing laws and/or the BCDA. Additional contract documents or information prescribed by the GPPB that are subsequently required for submission after the contract execution, such as the Notice to Proceed, Variation Orders, and Warranty Security, shall likewise form part of this Contract.
- 3. In consideration for the sum of <u>Seven Million Six Hundred Twenty Three</u> <u>Thousand Four Hundred Eighty Two and 45/100 (Php 7,623,482.45)</u> or such other sums as may be ascertained, **Dark Horse Security Agency, Inc.**

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agrees to the Contract for the Procurement of Security Services for the International Cable Landing Stations and Repeater Stations in accordance with its Bid.

BCDA agrees to pay the above-mentioned sum in accordance with the terms of the Bidding.



GENERAL CONDITIONS
OF CONTRACT

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1. Definitions

- 1.1. In this Contract, the following terms shall be interpreted as indicated:
- (a) "The Contract" means the agreement entered into between the Procuring Entity and the Supplier, as recorded in the Contract Form signed by the parties, including all attachments and appendices thereto and all documents incorporated by reference therein.
- (b) "The Contract Price" means the price payable to the Supplier under the Contract for the full and proper performance of its contractual obligations.
- (c) "The Goods" means all of the supplies, equipment, machinery, spare parts, other materials and/or general support services which the Supplier is required to provide to the Procuring Entity under the Contract.
- (d) "The Services" means those services ancillary to the supply of the Goods, such as transportation and insurance, and any other incidental services, such as installation, commissioning, provision of technical assistance, training, and other such obligations of the Supplier covered under the Contract.
- (e) "GCC" means the General Conditions of Contract contained in this Section.
- (f) "SCC" means the Special Conditions of Contract.
- (g) "The Procuring Entity" means the organization purchasing the Goods, as named in the SCC.
- (h) "The Procuring Entity's country" is the Philippines.
- (i) "The Supplier" means the individual contractor, manufacturer distributor, or firm supplying/manufacturing the Goods and Services under this Contract and named in the SCC.
- (j) The "Funding Source" means the organization named in the SCC.
- (k) "The Project Site," where applicable, means the place or places named in the SCC.
- (1) "Day" means calendar day.
- (m) The "Effective Date" of the contract will be the date of signing the contract, however the Supplier shall commence performance of its obligations only upon receipt of the Notice to Proceed and copy of the approved contract.
- (n) "Verified Report" refers to the report submitted by the Implementing Unit to the HoPE setting forth its findings as to the existence of

grounds or causes for termination and explicitly stating its recommendation for the issuance of a Notice to Terminate.

2. Corrupt, Fraudulent, Collusive, and Coercive Practices

- 2.1. Unless otherwise provided in the SCC, the Procuring Entity as well as the bidders, contractors, or suppliers shall observe the highest standard of ethics during the procurement and execution of this Contract. In pursuance of this policy, the Procuring Entity:
- (a) defines, for the purposes of this provision, the terms set forth below as follows:
 - (i) "corrupt practice" means behavior on the part of officials in the public or private sectors by which they improperly and unlawfully enrich themselves, others, or induce others to do so, by misusing the position in which they are placed, and it includes the offering, giving, receiving, or soliciting of anything of value to influence the action of any such official in the procurement process or in contract execution; entering, on behalf of the Government, into any contract or transaction manifestly and grossly disadvantageous to the same, whether or not the public officer profited or will profit thereby, and similar acts as provided in Republic Act 3019.
 - (ii) "fraudulent practice" means a misrepresentation of facts in order to influence a procurement process or the execution of a contract to the detriment of the Procuring Entity, and includes collusive practices among Bidders (prior to or after bid submission) designed to establish bid prices at artificial, noncompetitive levels and to deprive the Procuring Entity of the benefits of free and open competition.
 - (iii) "collusive practices" means a scheme or arrangement between two or more Bidders, with or without the knowledge of the Procuring Entity, designed to establish bid prices at artificial, non-competitive levels.
 - (iv) "coercive practices" means harming or threatening to harm, directly or indirectly, persons, or their property to influence their participation in a procurement process, or affect the execution of a contract;
 - (v) "obstructive practice" is
 - (aa) deliberately destroying, falsifying, altering or concealing of evidence material to an administrative proceedings or investigation or making false statements to investigators in order to materially impede an administrative proceedings or investigation of the Procuring Entity or any foreign government/foreign or

international financing institution into allegations of a corrupt, fraudulent, coercive or collusive practice; and/or threatening, harassing or intimidating any party to prevent it from disclosing its knowledge of matters relevant to the administrative proceedings or investigation or from pursuing such proceedings or investigation; or

- (bb) acts intended to materially impede the exercise of the inspection and audit rights of the Procuring Entity or any foreign government/foreign or international financing institution herein.
- (b) will reject a proposal for award if it determines that the Bidder recommended for award has engaged in any of the practices mentioned in this Clause for purposes of competing for the contract.
- 2.2. Further the Funding Source, Borrower or Procuring Entity, as appropriate, will seek to impose the maximum civil, administrative and/or criminal penalties available under the applicable law on individuals and organizations deemed to be involved with any of the practices mentioned in GCC Clause 2.1(a).

3. Inspection and Audit by the Funding Source

The Supplier shall permit the Funding Source to inspect the Supplier's accounts and records relating to the performance of the Supplier and to have them audited by auditors appointed by the Funding Source, if so required by the Funding Source.

4. Governing Law and Language

- 4.1. This Contract shall be interpreted in accordance with the laws of the Republic of the Philippines.
- 4.2. This Contract has been executed in the English language, which shall be the binding and controlling language for all matters relating to the meaning or interpretation of this Contract. All correspondence and other documents pertaining to this Contract exchanged by the parties shall be written in English.

5. Notices

5.1. Any notice, request, or consent required or permitted to be given or made pursuant to this Contract shall be in writing. Any such notice, request, or consent shall be deemed to have been given or made when received by the concerned party, either in person or through an authorized representative of the Party to whom the communication is addressed, or when sent by registered mail, telex, telegram, or facsimile to such Party at the address specified in the SCC, which shall be

- effective when delivered and duly received or on the notice's effective date, whichever is later.
- 5.2. A Party may change its address for notice hereunder by giving the other Party notice of such change pursuant to the provisions listed in the SCC for GCC Clause 5.1.

6. Scope of Contract

- 6.1. The Goods and Related Services to be provided shall be as specified in Section VI. Schedule of Requirements.
- 6.2. This Contract shall include all such items, although not specifically mentioned, that can be reasonably inferred as being required for its completion as if such items were expressly mentioned herein. Any additional requirements for the completion of this Contract shall be provided in the SCC.

7. Subcontracting

- 7.1. Subcontracting of any portion of the Goods, if allowed in the **BDS**, does not relieve the Supplier of any liability or obligation under this Contract. The Supplier will be responsible for the acts, defaults, and negligence of any subcontractor, its agents, servants or workmen as fully as if these were the Supplier's own acts, defaults, or negligence, or those of its agents, servants or workmen.
- 7.2. If subcontracting is allowed, the Supplier may identify its subcontractor during contract implementation. Subcontractors disclosed and identified during the bidding may be changed during the implementation of this Contract. In either case, subcontractors must submit the documentary requirements under ITB Clause 12 and comply with the eligibility criteria specified in the <u>BDS</u>. In the event that any subcontractor is found by the Procuring Entity to be ineligible, the subcontracting of such portion of the Goods shall be disallowed.

8. Procuring Entity's Responsibilities

- 8.1. Whenever the performance of the obligations in this Contract requires that the Supplier obtain permits, approvals, import, and other licenses from local public authorities, the Procuring Entity shall, if so needed by the Supplier, make its best effort to assist the Supplier in complying with such requirements in a timely and expeditious manner.
- 8.2. The Procuring Entity shall pay all costs involved in the performance of its responsibilities in accordance with GCC Clause 6.

9. Prices

9.1. For the given scope of work in this Contract as awarded, all bid prices are considered fixed prices, and therefore not subject to price escalation

during contract implementation, except under extraordinary circumstances and upon prior approval of the GPPB in accordance with Section 61 of R.A. 9184 and its IRR or except as provided in this Clause.

9.2. Prices charged by the Supplier for Goods delivered and/or services performed under this Contract shall not vary from the prices quoted by the Supplier in its bid, with the exception of any change in price resulting from a Change Order issued in accordance with GCC Clause 29.

10. Payment

- 10.1. Payments shall be made only upon a certification by the HoPE to the effect that the Goods have been rendered or delivered in accordance with the terms of this Contract and have been duly inspected and accepted. Except with the prior approval of the President no payment shall be made for services not yet rendered or for supplies and materials not yet delivered under this Contract. Ten percent (10%) of the amount of each payment shall be retained by the Procuring Entity to cover the Supplier's warranty obligations under this Contract as described in GCC Clause 17.
- 10.2. The Supplier's request(s) for payment shall be made to the Procuring Entity in writing, accompanied by an invoice describing, as appropriate, the Goods delivered and/or Services performed, and by documents submitted pursuant to the SCC provision for GCC Clause 6.2, and upon fulfillment of other obligations stipulated in this Contract.
- 10.3. Pursuant to GCC Clause 10.2, payments shall be made promptly by the Procuring Entity, but in no case later than sixty (60) days after submission of an invoice or claim by the Supplier. Payments shall be in accordance with the schedule stated in the SCC.
- 10.4. Unless otherwise provided in the <u>SCC</u>, the currency in which payment is made to the Supplier under this Contract shall be in Philippine Pesos.
- 10.5. Unless otherwise provided in the <u>SCC</u>, payments using Letter of Credit (LC), in accordance with the Guidelines issued by the GPPB, is allowed. For this purpose, the amount of provisional sum is indicated in the <u>SCC</u>. All charges for the opening of the LC and/or incidental expenses thereto shall be for the account of the Supplier.

11. Advance Payment and Terms of Payment

11.1. Advance payment shall be made only after prior approval of the President, and shall not exceed fifteen percent (15%) of the Contract amount, unless otherwise directed by the President or in cases allowed under Annex "D" of RA 9184.

- 11.2. All progress payments shall first be charged against the advance payment until the latter has been fully exhausted.
- 11.3. For Goods supplied from abroad, unless otherwise indicated in the **SCC**, the terms of payment shall be as follows:
- (a) On Contract Signature: Fifteen Percent (15%) of the Contract Price shall be paid within sixty (60) days from signing of the Contract and upon submission of a claim and a bank guarantee for the equivalent amount valid until the Goods are delivered and in the form provided in Section VIII. Bidding Forms.
- (b) On Delivery: Sixty-five percent (65%) of the Contract Price shall be paid to the Supplier within sixty (60) days after the date of receipt of the Goods and upon submission of the documents (i) through (vi) specified in the SCC provision on Delivery and Documents.
- (c) On Acceptance: The remaining twenty percent (20%) of the Contract Price shall be paid to the Supplier within sixty (60) days after the date of submission of the acceptance and inspection certificate for the respective delivery issued by the Procuring Entity's authorized representative. In the event that no inspection or acceptance certificate is issued by the Procuring Entity's authorized representative within forty five (45) days of the date shown on the delivery receipt, the Supplier shall have the right to claim payment of the remaining twenty percent (20%) subject to the Procuring Entity's own verification of the reason(s) for the failure to issue documents (vii) and (viii) as described in the SCC provision on Delivery and Documents.

12. Taxes and Duties

The Supplier, whether local or foreign, shall be entirely responsible for all the necessary taxes, stamp duties, license fees, and other such levies imposed for the completion of this Contract.

13. Performance Security

- 13.1. Within ten (10) calendar days from receipt of the Notice of Award from the Procuring Entity but in no case later than the signing of the contract by both parties, the successful Bidder shall furnish the performance security in any the forms prescribed in the ITB Clause 33.2.
- 13.2. The performance security posted in favor of the Procuring Entity shall be forfeited in the event it is established that the winning bidder is in default in any of its obligations under the contract.
- 13.3. The performance security shall remain valid until issuance by the Procuring Entity of the Certificate of Final Acceptance.

- 13.4. The performance security may be released by the Procuring Entity and returned to the Supplier after the issuance of the Certificate of Final Acceptance subject to the following conditions:
- (a) There are no pending claims against the Supplier or the surety company filed by the Procuring Entity;
- (b) The Supplier has no pending claims for labor and materials filed against it; and
- (c) Other terms specified in the SCC.
- 13.5. In case of a reduction of the contract value, the Procuring Entity shall allow a proportional reduction in the original performance security, provided that any such reduction is more than ten percent (10%) and that the aggregate of such reductions is not more than fifty percent (50%) of the original performance security.

14. Use of Contract Documents and Information

- 14.1. The Supplier shall not, except for purposes of performing the obligations in this Contract, without the Procuring Entity's prior written consent, disclose this Contract, or any provision thereof, or any specification, plan, drawing, pattern, sample, or information furnished by or on behalf of the Procuring Entity. Any such disclosure shall be made in confidence and shall extend only as far as may be necessary for purposes of such performance.
- 14.2. Any document, other than this Contract itself, enumerated in GCC Clause 14.1 shall remain the property of the Procuring Entity and shall be returned (all copies) to the Procuring Entity on completion of the Supplier's performance under this Contract if so required by the Procuring Entity.

15. Standards

The Goods provided under this Contract shall conform to the standards mentioned in the Section VII. Technical Specifications; and, when no applicable standard is mentioned, to the authoritative standards appropriate to the Goods' country of origin. Such standards shall be the latest issued by the institution concerned.

16. Inspection and Tests

16.1. The Procuring Entity or its representative shall have the right to inspect and/or to test the Goods to confirm their conformity to the Contract specifications at no extra cost to the Procuring Entity. The SCC and Section VII. Technical Specifications shall specify what inspections and/or tests the Procuring Entity requires and where they are to be conducted. The Procuring Entity shall notify the Supplier in writing, in a timely manner, of the identity of any representatives retained for these purposes.

- 16.2. If applicable, the inspections and tests may be conducted on the premises of the Supplier or its subcontractor(s), at point of delivery, and/or at the goods' final destination. If conducted on the premises of the Supplier or its subcontractor(s), all reasonable facilities and assistance, including access to drawings and production data, shall be furnished to the inspectors at no charge to the Procuring Entity. The Supplier shall provide the Procuring Entity with results of such inspections and tests.
- 16.3. The Procuring Entity or its designated representative shall be entitled to attend the tests and/or inspections referred to in this Clause provided that the Procuring Entity shall bear all of its own costs and expenses incurred in connection with such attendance including, but not limited to, all traveling and board and lodging expenses.
- 16.4. The Procuring Entity may reject any Goods or any part thereof that fail to pass any test and/or inspection or do not conform to the specifications. The Supplier shall either rectify or replace such rejected Goods or parts thereof or make alterations necessary to meet the specifications at no cost to the Procuring Entity, and shall repeat the test and/or inspection, at no cost to the Procuring Entity, upon giving a notice pursuant to GCC Clause 5.
- 16.5. The Supplier agrees that neither the execution of a test and/or inspection of the Goods or any part thereof, nor the attendance by the Procuring Entity or its representative, shall release the Supplier from any warranties or other obligations under this Contract.

17. Warranty

- 17.1. The Supplier warrants that the Goods supplied under the Contract are new, unused, or the most recent or current models, and that they incorporate all recent improvements in design and materials, except when the technical specifications required by the Procuring Entity provide otherwise.
- 17.2. The Supplier further warrants that all Goods supplied under this Contract shall have no defect, arising from design, materials, or workmanship or from any act or omission of the Supplier that may develop under normal use of the supplied Goods in the conditions prevailing in the country of final destination.
- 17.3. In order to assure that manufacturing defects shall be corrected by the Supplier, a warranty shall be required from the Supplier for a minimum period specified in the SCC. The obligation for the warranty shall be covered by, at the Supplier's option, either retention money in an amount equivalent to at least one percent (1%) of every progress payment, or a special bank guarantee equivalent to at least one percent (1%) of the total Contract Price or other such amount if so specified in the SCC. The said amounts shall only be released after the lapse of the warranty period specified in the SCC; provided, however, that the

Supplies delivered are free from patent and latent defects and all the conditions imposed under this Contract have been fully met.

- 17.4. The Procuring Entity shall promptly notify the Supplier in writing of any claims arising under this warranty. Upon receipt of such notice, the Supplier shall, within the period specified in the SCC and with all reasonable speed, repair or replace the defective Goods or parts thereof, without cost to the Procuring Entity.
- 17.5. If the Supplier, having been notified, fails to remedy the defect(s) within the period specified in GCC Clause 17.4, the Procuring Entity may proceed to take such remedial action as may be necessary, at the Supplier's risk and expense and without prejudice to any other rights which the Procuring Entity may have against the Supplier under the Contract and under the applicable law.

18. Delays in the Supplier's Performance

- 18.1. Delivery of the Goods and/or performance of Services shall be made by the Supplier in accordance with the time schedule prescribed by the Procuring Entity in Section VI. Schedule of Requirements.
- 18.2. If at any time during the performance of this Contract, the Supplier or its Subcontractor(s) should encounter conditions impeding timely delivery of the Goods and/or performance of Services, the Supplier shall promptly notify the Procuring Entity in writing of the fact of the delay, its likely duration and its cause(s). As soon as practicable after receipt of the Supplier's notice, and upon causes provided for under GCC Clause 22, the Procuring Entity shall evaluate the situation and may extend the Supplier's time for performance, in which case the extension shall be ratified by the parties by amendment of Contract.
- 18.3. Except as provided under GCC Clause 22, a delay by the Supplier in the performance of its obligations shall render the Supplier liable to the imposition of liquidated damages pursuant to GCC Clause 19, unless an extension of time is agreed upon pursuant to GCC Clause 29 without the application of liquidated damages.

19. Liquidated Damages

Subject to GCC Clauses 18 and 22, if the Supplier fails to satisfactorily deliver any or all of the Goods and/or to perform the Services within the period(s) specified in this Contract inclusive of duly granted time extensions if any, the Procuring Entity shall, without prejudice to its other remedies under this Contract and under the applicable law, deduct from the Contract Price, as liquidated damages, the applicable rate of one tenth (1/10) of one (1) percent of the cost of the unperformed portion for every day of delay until actual delivery or performance. The maximum deduction shall be ten percent (10%) of the amount of contract. Once the maximum is reached, the

Procuring Entity may rescind or terminate the Contract pursuant to GCC Clause 23, without prejudice to other courses of action and remedies open to it.

20. Settlement of Disputes

- 20.1. If any dispute or difference of any kind whatsoever shall arise between the Procuring Entity and the Supplier in connection with or arising out of this Contract, the parties shall make every effort to resolve amicably such dispute or difference by mutual consultation.
- 20.2. If after thirty (30) days, the parties have failed to resolve their dispute or difference by such mutual consultation, then either the Procuring Entity or the Supplier may give notice to the other party of its intention to commence arbitration, as hereinafter provided, as to the matter in dispute, and no arbitration in respect of this matter may be commenced unless such notice is given.
- 20.3. Any dispute or difference in respect of which a notice of intention to commence arbitration has been given in accordance with this Clause shall be settled by arbitration. Arbitration may be commenced prior to or after delivery of the Goods under this Contract.
- 20.4. In the case of a dispute between the Procuring Entity and the Supplier, the dispute shall be resolved in accordance with Republic Act 9285 ("R.A. 9285"), otherwise known as the "Alternative Dispute Resolution Act of 2004."
- 20.5. Notwithstanding any reference to arbitration herein, the parties shall continue to perform their respective obligations under the Contract unless they otherwise agree; and the Procuring Entity shall pay the Supplier any monies due the Supplier.

21. Liability of the Supplier

- 21.1. The Supplier's liability under this Contract shall be as provided by the laws of the Republic of the Philippines, subject to additional provisions, if any, set forth in the SCC.
- 21.2. Except in cases of criminal negligence or willful misconduct, and in the case of infringement of patent rights, if applicable, the aggregate liability of the Supplier to the Procuring Entity shall not exceed the total Contract Price, provided that this limitation shall not apply to the cost of repairing or replacing defective equipment.

22. Force Majeure

22.1. The Supplier shall not be liable for forfeiture of its performance security, liquidated damages, or termination for default if and to the extent that the Supplier's delay in performance or other failure to perform its obligations under the Contract is the result of a *force majeure*.

- 22.2. For purposes of this Contract the terms "force majeure" and "fortuitous event" may be used interchangeably. In this regard, a fortuitous event or force majeure shall be interpreted to mean an event which the Supplier could not have foreseen, or which though foreseen, was inevitable. It shall not include ordinary unfavorable weather conditions; and any other cause the effects of which could have been avoided with the exercise of reasonable diligence by the Supplier. Such events may include, but not limited to, acts of the Procuring Entity in its sovereign capacity, wars or revolutions, fires, floods, epidemics, quarantine restrictions, and freight embargoes.
- 22.3. If a *force majeure* situation arises, the Supplier shall promptly notify the Procuring Entity in writing of such condition and the cause thereof. Unless otherwise directed by the Procuring Entity in writing, the Supplier shall continue to perform its obligations under the Contract as far as is reasonably practical, and shall seek all reasonable alternative means for performance not prevented by the *force majeure*.

23. Termination for Default

- 23.1. The Procuring Entity shall terminate this Contract for default when any of the following conditions attends its implementation:
- (a) Outside of *force majeure*, the Supplier fails to deliver or perform any or all of the Goods within the period(s) specified in the contract, or within any extension thereof granted by the Procuring Entity pursuant to a request made by the Supplier prior to the delay, and such failure amounts to at least ten percent (10%) of the contact price;
- (b) As a result of *force majeure*, the Supplier is unable to deliver or perform any or all of the Goods, amounting to at least ten percent (10%) of the contract price, for a period of not less than sixty (60) calendar days after receipt of the notice from the Procuring Entity stating that the circumstance of force majeure is deemed to have ceased; or
- (c) The Supplier fails to perform any other obligation under the Contract.
- 23.2. In the event the Procuring Entity terminates this Contract in whole or in part, for any of the reasons provided under GCC Clauses 23 to 26, the Procuring Entity may procure, upon such terms and in such manner as it deems appropriate, Goods or Services similar to those undelivered, and the Supplier shall be liable to the Procuring Entity for any excess costs for such similar Goods or Services. However, the Supplier shall continue performance of this Contract to the extent not terminated.
- 23.3. In case the delay in the delivery of the Goods and/or performance of the Services exceeds a time duration equivalent to ten percent (10%) of the specified contract time plus any time extension duly granted to the Supplier, the Procuring Entity may terminate this Contract, forfeit the

Supplier's performance security and award the same to a qualified Supplier.

24. Termination for Insolvency

The Procuring Entity shall terminate this Contract if the Supplier is declared bankrupt or insolvent as determined with finality by a court of competent jurisdiction. In this event, termination will be without compensation to the Supplier, provided that such termination will not prejudice or affect any right of action or remedy which has accrued or will accrue thereafter to the Procuring Entity and/or the Supplier.

Termination for Convenience

- 24.1. The Procuring Entity may terminate this Contract, in whole or in part, at any time for its convenience. The HoPE may terminate a contract for the convenience of the Government if he has determined the existence of conditions that make Project Implementation economically, financially or technically impractical and/or unnecessary, such as, but not limited to, fortuitous event(s) or changes in law and national government policies.
- 24.2. The Goods that have been delivered and/or performed or are ready for delivery or performance within thirty (30) calendar days after the Supplier's receipt of Notice to Terminate shall be accepted by the Procuring Entity at the contract terms and prices. For Goods not yet performed and/or ready for delivery, the Procuring Entity may elect:
- (a) to have any portion delivered and/or performed and paid at the contract terms and prices; and/or
- (b) to cancel the remainder and pay to the Supplier an agreed amount for partially completed and/or performed goods and for materials and parts previously procured by the Supplier.
- 24.3. If the Supplier suffers loss in its initial performance of the terminated contract, such as purchase of raw materials for goods specially manufactured for the Procuring Entity which cannot be sold in open market, it shall be allowed to recover partially from this Contract, on a quantum meruit basis. Before recovery may be made, the fact of loss must be established under oath by the Supplier to the satisfaction of the Procuring Entity before recovery may be made.

25. Termination for Unlawful Acts

25.1. The Procuring Entity may terminate this Contract in case it is determined prima facie that the Supplier has engaged, before or during the implementation of this Contract, in unlawful deeds and behaviors relative to contract acquisition and implementation. Unlawful acts include, but are not limited to, the following:

- (a) Corrupt, fraudulent, and coercive practices as defined in **ITB** Clause 3.1(a);
- (b) Drawing up or using forged documents;
- (c) Using adulterated materials, means or methods, or engaging in production contrary to rules of science or the trade; and
- (d) Any other act analogous to the foregoing.

26. Procedures for Termination of Contracts

- 26.1. The following provisions shall govern the procedures for termination of this Contract:
- (a) Upon receipt of a written report of acts or causes which may constitute ground(s) for termination as aforementioned, or upon its own initiative, the Implementing Unit shall, within a period of seven (7) calendar days, verify the existence of such ground(s) and cause the execution of a Verified Report, with all relevant evidence attached;
- (b) Upon recommendation by the Implementing Unit, the HoPE shall terminate this Contract only by a written notice to the Supplier conveying the termination of this Contract. The notice shall state:
 - (i) that this Contract is being terminated for any of the ground(s) afore-mentioned, and a statement of the acts that constitute the ground(s) constituting the same;
 - (ii) the extent of termination, whether in whole or in part;
 - (iii) an instruction to the Supplier to show cause as to why this Contract should not be terminated; and
 - (iv) special instructions of the Procuring Entity, if any.
- (c) The Notice to Terminate shall be accompanied by a copy of the Verified Report;
- (d) Within a period of seven (7) calendar days from receipt of the Notice of Termination, the Supplier shall submit to the HoPE a verified position paper stating why this Contract should not be terminated. If the Supplier fails to show cause after the lapse of the seven (7) day period, either by inaction or by default, the HoPE shall issue an order terminating this Contract;
- (e) The Procuring Entity may, at any time before receipt of the Supplier's verified position paper described in item (d) above withdraw the Notice to Terminate if it is determined that certain items or works subject of the notice had been completed, delivered, or performed before the Supplier's receipt of the notice;

- (f) Within a non-extendible period of ten (10) calendar days from receipt of the verified position paper, the HoPE shall decide whether or not to terminate this Contract. It shall serve a written notice to the Supplier of its decision and, unless otherwise provided, this Contract is deemed terminated from receipt of the Supplier of the notice of decision. The termination shall only be based on the ground(s) stated in the Notice to Terminate;
- (g) The HoPE may create a Contract Termination Review Committee (CTRC) to assist him in the discharge of this function. All decisions recommended by the CTRC shall be subject to the approval of the HoPE; and
- (h) The Supplier must serve a written notice to the Procuring Entity of its intention to terminate the contract at least thirty (30) calendar days before its intended termination. The Contract is deemed terminated if it is not resumed in thirty (30) calendar days after the receipt of such notice by the Procuring Entity.

27. Assignment of Rights

The Supplier shall not assign his rights or obligations under this Contract, in whole or in part, except with the Procuring Entity's prior written consent.

28. Contract Amendment

Subject to applicable laws, no variation in or modification of the terms of this Contract shall be made except by written amendment signed by the parties.

29. Application

These General Conditions shall apply to the extent that they are not superseded by provisions of other parts of this Contract.

TERMS OF REFERENCE (TOR) PROCUREMENT OF SECURITY SERVICES FOR THE INTERNATIONAL CABLE LANDING AND REPEATER STATIONS

I. Background of Item Being Procured

General Overview of the Procurement Project

The Department of Information and Communications Technology (DICT) is in need of a SECURITY AGENCY that can provide the necessary and investigation services to protect and safeguard the properties and interests of the DICT, whose critical facilities are located at the following sites:

- i. DICT Luzon Cluster 1
- International Cable Landing Station, California Ave., Barangay San Francisco, San Fernando City, La Union
- Repeater Station, Brgy. Cataguintingan, Rosario, La Union
- Repeater Station, Brgy. Poblacion, Sta. Maria, Pangasinan
- ii. DICT Luzon Cluster 2
- International Cable Landing Station, ATC Compound, Brgy. Calabuanan, Baler, Aurora
- Repeater Station, Brgy. Tulat, San Jose City, Nueva Ecija
- Repeater Station, Brgy. Marikit, Pantabangan, Nueva Ecija

II. Purpose of the Procurement

The purpose of this procurement is to provide the 24/7 security and investigation services to protect and safeguard the properties and interests of the DICT's critical facilities.

III. Mode of Procurement

The mode of procurement is Public Bidding.

IV. Nature of Procurement

The nature of procurement is Goods and Services

V. Scope of Works

The SECURITY AGENCY should be duly licensed in accordance with Republic Act 5487, as amended and recognized by the government, to render protective, detective and security service within the Philippines, including Metro Manila and has very satisfactory performance records from previous Offices served in safeguarding and protecting properties against theft, pilferage, robbery and other similar unlawful and destructive acts.

A. Responsibility Areas

The SECURITY AGENCY shall diligently and faithfully serve the DICT in the provision of security services, as aforementioned, on a twenty four (24) hour per day basis including Saturdays, Sundays and Holidays and shall abide by the instructions of the DICT relative to such services. Security guards shall be posted and distributed in accordance with the NPF/NPCE/BNP Schedule of guards.

The SECURITY AGENCY shall undertake the following:

- Prepare a Security Plan on the monitoring of activities in all designated areas in the DICT which shall be presented to the management for final approval. Said plan shall form part of the CONTRACT;
- b. Provide guards who are in their proper uniforms or, in the case of the Supervising Guards, formally attired, per requirement of the DICT;
- Provide adequate firearms and ammunitions to each guard as well as, such equipment (e.g. CCTV) and paraphernalia (e.g. first aide kit) as maybe necessary in the discharge of their duties;
- d. See to it that all guards assigned to the DICT are at all times vigilant, honest, dependable and aware of their duty to protect lives and limbs of personnel and finally protect the properties of the DICT;
- e. Make sure that all guards remain courteous to all employees and guests to protect the proper image of the DICT;
- f. The Security Guard per station must conduct frequent inspection, day and night;
- g. Ensure that unauthorized persons are kept out of guarded premises:
- h. Guarantee peace and order within the guarded premises at all times;
- Make available, at all times, duly-licensed, trained and qualified reliever guards in case of the absence of any assigned guard, for the continuous uninterrupted security services in the DICT premises.

Make sure that the duty schedule of each Guard should not be more than Eight (8) hours;

- j. Change any guard who does not measure up to the standards or criteria of the DICT as soon as the SECURITY AGENCY is informed of the request for replacement, and conversely, not to change or replace any assigned guard without the consent of the DICT;
- Submit and surrender all record books used for monitoring and recording activities in the whole Building and those of the personnel. The designated Guard per station must submit monthly report to the FOO Cluster Director;
- I. To comply with all existing laws, rules and regulations relative to the operations of security agencies.

B. General Conditions

- a. The SECURITY AGENCY must be duly licensed by the Philippine National Police (PNP) Supervisory Office for Security and Investigation Agency (SOSIA), registered and a member of PADPAO with proper operating permits and other statutory requirements. It must have an experience of at least five (5) years.
- b. The DICT, whenever necessary, may request for the reduction or increase in the number of security guards of the SECURITY AGENCY, as may be required, provided that due written notice thereof shall be served upon the SECURITY AGENCY, in which case, the corresponding adjustment in the compensation as prescribed herein, shall be paid by the DICT to the SECURITY AGENCY. The increase or decrease in the number of personnel may be done without the need of executing a supplemental agreement.
- c. The DICT, at all times, has the right to inspect the guards on detail at the premises and, at any time, request for the immediate replacement of any guard or guards assigned under the contract. Such request for replacement must always be in writing;
- d. That the SECURITY AGENCY shall be responsible for compliance to all government regulations in connection with the performance of its contractual obligations to the DICT OFFICE/FACILITIES, such as permits and licenses;
- e. The relationship of the SECURITY AGENCY to the DICT shall be that of an independent Contractor;
- f. The DICT have the right to give guards, either or through the SECURITY AGENCY, instructions regarding the performance of the duties assigned to them. Guard per station should undergo briefings

and training on how to operate equipment in the stations watch during brownouts or when natural catastrophic occur.

- g. In the occurrence of any loss or damage to the DICT properties, the DICT and the SECURITY AGENCY (and vice versa) shall report the incident in writing, through its Executive Director/Detachment Commander, within twenty four (24) hours after its occurrence or discovery. Upon confirmation of such damage or loss of property by both parties, the SECURITY AGENCY and DICT shall conduct a thorough investigation. If the resulting investigation finds the security guards or officers of the SECURITY AGENCY at fault, it shall assume responsibility for any loss or damage to property suffered by the DICT, as a result of theft, pilferage and/or robbery particularly when proper inventory and turnover was duly observed and recorded.
- h. The SECURITY AGENCY however, shall not be held liable for losses or damages due to force majeure, or to fortuitous events, or to any of the following causes:
 - 1. Where the loss occurred inside a closed and locked stockroom and/or office, except where it has been proven that the door or any of the part of the building has been forcibly opened or the lock thereof destroyed through force or violence; and PROVIDED further, that the same has been reported to the police SECURITY AGENCY and/or to the guard of the SECURITY AGENCY, immediately upon its discovery.
 - 2. For the loss of any property belonging to the DICT, which are kept in the open area or storage and have not been duly turned over to the SECURITY AGENCY, or its duly authorized representatives, for physical and proper recording, or, although not kept in an open space/or storage, but not been issued to the DICT employees;
 - 3. Where such loss was a result of any or all of the following: Mob Violence, Tumultuous, Acts of Dissidence, War, Insurrection or Revolution, Rebellion, Violent Uprising, Demonstration or Rally:
 - 4. Loss of pocketable items and valuables.
- i. The SECURITY AGENCY shall indemnify the DICT for any loss or damage to property the DICT may suffer during the tour of duty of the SECURITY AGENCY's guards, PROVIDED, that said loss or damage is not due to the sole negligence of the DICT. However, when such loss or damage is cause by "force majeure" or fortuitous events, the SECURITY AGENCY may not be held responsible.
- j. In cases where the SECURITY AGENCY shall have to indemnify the DICT for losses or damages suffered by the DICT under conditions stipulated under item "g" and "h" of this Terms of Reference (TOR),

determination of the value of the property lost or damage shall be done by the DICT Chief Accountant, based on the current value of the property in the free market. Payment for the indemnity shall be made within sixty (60) days after the final result of the investigation has been served to the DICT, without any need for demand from the DICT.

- k. The SECURITY AGENCY shall fully agree to free or absolve the DICT from any liability, causes of action or claims which may be filed against their guards, by reason of their employment by the SECURITY AGENCY or by third party, arising or connected to the performance of a guard's duty under the agreement, whether under the provisions of the Wage Law, Workmen's Compensation Law or under any law which are now in effect.
- It should be expressly understood and agreed that the guards of the SECURITY AGENCY are in no sense employees of the DICT and, as such the SECURITY AGENCY shall assume full responsibility for and shall free or acquit the DICT from any claim or claims for personal injury or damage or death arising out of, or in the course of performance of guard duties, of said guards.

G. Bond

The SECURITY AGENCY shall post a Performance Bond to be secured from any bonding institution or Government Service Insurance System (GSIS) to answer the damages or losses that the DICT may suffer attribute to the willful act or negligence of the SECURITY AGENCY or any other obligation or liability which may hereunder be outstanding during the lifetime of the Contract. Provided, further, that the liability of the SECURITY AGENCY shall not be limited to the performance bond but not the SECURITY AGENCY shall still be liable for any deficiency thereon.

VI. Project Deliverables

The SECURITY AGENCY shall assume responsibility with regards to compliance with requirements of the New Labor Code, specifically those applicable provisions on the night shift differential and overtime work, the Social Security Service Act and other laws pertaining to Employer-Employee relationship. The DICT may require the SECURITY AGENCY to show or produce papers, receipts of payment of SSS, PhilHealth and other evidence to show compliance to the New Labor Code.

- The SECURITY AGENCY shall submit to the DICT its registration or city permit from PNPSOSIA, and a certificate of good standing immediately.
- 3. The SECURITY AGENCY shall submit to the DICT qualification requirements including extensive bio-data, properly annotated license papers, etc., for each of security personnel to be assigned at the DICT OFFICE's site, prior to assumption of duty. The SECURITY AGENCY shall submit the bio-data of at least twice the number of the proposed personnel required, from which the DICT can exercise its option to select those that will be assigned to them.
- 4. The SECURITY AGENCY shall provide each guard with appropriate uniform, which will be worn always while on tour of duty.
- 5. Any change in personnel to be assigned at the DICT shall require clearance from the Administrative Service Director and shall automatically require submission of qualification papers.
- 6. Salaries of security personnel should follow the acceptable rate of the prevailing wage order. However, the business expense for Agency Fee should have already been incorporated in its bid price at the time the bidding was conducted. Hence no additional agency fees shall be charged during the duration of the contract.

VII. Project Cost

Approved Budget for the Contract (ABC) of Project and Fund Source

The ABC for one (1) year is **PhP 7,650,000.** The Procuring Entity will have the option of renewing the contract every year depending on the performance of the Security Agency.

VIII. Payment Schedule

The ABC shall be paid by the DICT to the Security Agency at a monthly rate, subject to the availability of funds and in compliance to government auditing and accounting rules and regulations at the end of every month.

- 5. Certification of satisfactory performance by the DICT Administrative Service Director or his/her representative; and
- 6. Quarterly list of Employees Compensation/Remittance to SSS, PhilHealth and PAG-IBIG Fund.

Payments, however shall be subject to the usual accounting and auditing rules and regulations.

IX. Project Timeframe

Service Coverage: 12 months

Upon the expiration of the contract, an extension will be agreed upon by both parties. It will be renewable annually and upon any violation or unacceptable services, either incomplete work or required services not being performed, DICT has the right to terminate the contract anytime within the 1 year contract duration.

X. Project Source of Funds

The project will be funded by the Department of Information and Communication Technology chargeable against the National Broadband Program.

Security personnel, operators, employees and staffs shall be familiar with the information and procedures associated with this Security Plan.



Employee Identification:

 - b) The ID must be worn above the waist and be visible at all times to others while in buildings with public access and administrative areas.

 - f) Non-compliance with this policy or any breach of the security procedure should be reported immediately to the Head Security guard or any authorized personnel.

2. Visitor/Service Providers Pass:

- a) Visitors and Service Providers are required to sign in and receive a visitor's pass if they will be entering the AOR.
- b) Security guards will be trained to issue Visitor's passes to persons entering

- c) Visitors and Service Providers should be instructed to wear their badges properly while inside AOR.
- d) Any Visitor/Contractor not wearing a badge in a Secured Area should be questioned by employees, security guards or other authorized personnel to follow the provision of this policy.
- Covid-19 Protocol/Screening
 - temperature check, sanitation and contact tracing for all incoming employees/visitors/contractors
- Detection and Apprehension of criminal activities (Salisi Gang, Budol budol Gang and other Modus Operandi)
- Investigation of reported cases of theft and robbery
- C. Procedures & guidelines in facilitating actions on documents
 - C.1 Robbery and theft cases discovered by employees and other personnel.
 - a. Upon receipt of a report/complaint of a crime incident discovered by employee or personnel the guard shall immediately:
 - b. Record the time, date and place that the crime was discovered by the alleged victim and immediately inform his superior officer.
 - c. Advise the alleged victim or the complainant not to touch anything in the crime scene to prevent contamination of evidence.
 - d. If the victim/complainant has not yet entered his/her house or unit, she shall be advised not to enter immediately because of the possibility that the suspects are still inside the unit or house.
 - e. If the victim is in the gate or lobby, he/she shall not be allowed to return to his place without an escort guard or guards who shall secure him/her from a possible engagement with the suspect(s) if they are still inside the house, office or unit.
 - f. The first responding guards shall keep watch of the house, office or unit for possible arrest of the suspects while fleeing or engaging them in an armed engagement.
 - g. Inform the nearest police station for investigation.
 - h. Upon responding to the crime scene, the officer and guards shall endeavor to arrest the suspects is he is still at the crime scene or the first responder did not arrest he suspects.
 - i. Look for possible witnesses.
 - j. Upon arrival of the police, the Officer shall brief him of the incident report while no written report is immediately available.
 - k. The Officer shall turn-over the case to the police for their investigation.

- I. Inform the Security Agency and request for an investigator. If the Investigator is not available especially during the night, the Agency shall immediately inform the nearest inspector to the detachment even if the Detachment is not in his AOR.
- m. Inform the Security Manager or any persons who are the direct superiors of the guards for information and other instructions or guidance.
- C.2 Robbery cases discovered by the guards.
- a. The first guard who discovered the incident especially if there is forcible entry in the gate or office, he shall endeavor to be alert and watchful because of the possibility that the suspect(s) is/are still inside.
- b. He shall position him afar or maintain appropriate distance from the crime scene but shall see to it that the office, unit of house is visible from his position.
- c. Immediately summon his superior officer and additional guards to augment the security of the crime scene.
- d. Upon responding to the crime scene, the officer and guards shall endeavor to arrest the suspects is he is still at the crime scene or the first responder did not arrest he suspects.
- e. Look for possible witnesses.
- f. After the superior officer and responding guards has arrived, the officer shall make efforts to preserve the crime scene and advise the guard or guards to stay and do the following actions:
- g. Cordon off the crime scene with a yellow demarcation tape or any available materials so that strangers will not spill into the crime scene and contaminate evidences.
- h. Prevent the entry of unauthorized persons not in any way connected with the incident.
- i. If the victim or complainant timely arrived, the guard shall stop him/her and be told not to touch anything in the crime scene and tell him/her to wait for the police investigator for permission to enter.
- j. During the arrival of the police investigator the officer or first responder shall give briefing to the investigator and turn-over to him all the evidences gathered in the initial security investigation.
- k. The police are now on top of the official investigation while the officer or Security Agency may proceed with the parallel investigation.
- C.3 Accidents and other life threatening situations. (stabbing, shooting, drowning, etc.,)
 - a. If the incident is against persons such as stabbing, hit by a blunt object by an opponent, shooting incident, slip on the floor, drowning in the swimming pool and when in the assessment of the officer the incident is a life-threatening

- situation, he shall immediately evacuate the victim to the nearest hospital, pending the arrival of the Medics or ambulance.
- b. Upon responding to the crime scene, the officer and guards shall endeavor to arrest the suspects is he is still at the crime scene or the first responder did not arrest he suspects.
- c. Look for possible witnesses.
- d. Prevent entry of persons within the cordoned area.
- e. Prepare to brief the investigators and SOCO operatives.
- f. The Officer shall immediately inform the following persons before making an initial incident/spot report.

C. EMERGENCY RESPONSE:

Emergency response to incidents/events such as:

- a.) Fires
- b.) Earthquakes
- c.) Tsunamis/Floods
- d.) Criminal Activity
- e.) Bomb Threats

INSTRUCTION TO BIDDERS

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A. General

1. Scope of Bid

- 1.1. The Procuring Entity named in the **BDS** invites bids for the supply and delivery of the Goods as described in Section VII. Technical Specifications.
- 1.2. The name, identification, and number of lots specific to this bidding are provided in the **BDS**. The contracting strategy and basis of evaluation of lots is described in **ITB** Clause 28.

2. Source of Funds

The Procuring Entity has a budget or has received funds from the Funding Source named in the **BDS**, and in the amount indicated in the **BDS**. It intends to apply part of the funds received for the Project, as defined in the **BDS**, to cover eligible payments under the contract.

3. Corrupt, Fraudulent, Collusive, and Coercive Practices

- 3.1. Unless otherwise specified in the **BDS**, the Procuring Entity as well as the bidders and suppliers shall observe the highest standard of ethics during the procurement and execution of the contract. In pursuance of this policy, the Procuring Entity:
 - (a) defines, for purposes of this provision, the terms set forth below as follows:
 - (i) "corrupt practice" means behavior on the part of officials in the public or private sectors by which they improperly and unlawfully enrich themselves, others, or induce others to do so, by misusing the position in which they are placed, and includes the offering, giving, receiving, or soliciting of anything of value to influence the action of any such official in the procurement process or in contract execution; entering, on behalf of the government, into any contract or transaction manifestly and grossly disadvantageous to the same, whether or not the public officer profited or will profit thereby, and similar acts as provided in RA 3019.
 - (ii) "fraudulent practice" means a misrepresentation of facts in order to influence a procurement process or the execution of a contract to the detriment of the Procuring Entity, and includes collusive practices among Bidders (prior to or after bid submission) designed to establish bid prices at artificial, noncompetitive levels and to deprive the Procuring Entity of the benefits of free and open competition.
 - (iii) "collusive practices" means a scheme or arrangement between two or more Bidders, with or without the knowledge of the

Procuring Entity, designed to establish bid prices at artificial, non-competitive levels.

- (iv) "coercive practices" means harming or threatening to harm, directly or indirectly, persons, or their property to influence their participation in a procurement process, or affect the execution of a contract;
- (v) "obstructive practice" is
 - (aa) deliberately destroying, falsifying. altering concealing of evidence material to an administrative proceedings or investigation or making false statements to investigators in order to materially impede an administrative proceedings or investigation of the Procuring Entity or any foreign government/foreign or international financing institution into allegations of a corrupt, fraudulent, coercive or collusive practice; and/or threatening, harassing or intimidating any party to prevent it from disclosing its knowledge of matters relevant to the administrative proceedings investigation or from pursuing such proceedings or investigation; or
 - (bb) acts intended to materially impede the exercise of the inspection and audit rights of the Procuring Entity or any foreign government/foreign or international financing institution herein.
- (b) will reject a proposal for award if it determines that the Bidder recommended for award has engaged in any of the practices mentioned in this Clause for purposes of competing for the contract.
- 3.2. Further, the Procuring Entity will seek to impose the maximum civil, administrative, and/or criminal penalties available under applicable laws on individuals and organizations deemed to be involved in any of the practices mentioned in ITB Clause 3.1(a).
- 3.3. Furthermore, the Funding Source and the Procuring Entity reserve the right to inspect and audit records and accounts of a bidder or supplier in the bidding for and performance of a contract themselves or through independent auditors as reflected in the GCC Clause 3.

4. Conflict of Interest

4.1. All Bidders found to have conflicting interests shall be disqualified to participate in the procurement at hand, without prejudice to the imposition of appropriate administrative, civil, and criminal sanctions. A Bidder may be considered to have conflicting interests with another Bidder in any of the events described in paragraphs (a) through (c) below and a general conflict of

interest in any of the circumstances set out in paragraphs (d) through (g) below:

- (a) A Bidder has controlling shareholders in common with another Bidder;
- (b) A Bidder receives or has received any direct or indirect subsidy from any other Bidder;
- (c) A Bidder has the same legal representative as that of another Bidder for purposes of this bid;
- (d) A Bidder has a relationship, directly or through third parties, that puts them in a position to have access to information about or influence on the bid of another Bidder or influence the decisions of the Procuring Entity regarding this bidding process;
- (e) A Bidder submits more than one bid in this bidding process. However, this does not limit the participation of subcontractors in more than one bid;
- (f) A Bidder who participated as a consultant in the preparation of the design or technical specifications of the Goods and related services that are the subject of the bid; or
- (g) A Bidder who lends, or temporarily seconds, its personnel to firms or organizations which are engaged in consulting services for the preparation related to procurement for or implementation of the project, if the personnel would be involved in any capacity on the same project.
- 4.2. In accordance with Section 47 of the IRR of RA 9184, all Bidding Documents shall be accompanied by a sworn affidavit of the Bidder that it is not related to the Head of the Procuring Entity (HoPE), members of the Bids and Awards Committee (BAC), members of the Technical Working Group (TWG), members of the BAC Secretariat, the head of the Project Management Office (PMO) or the end-user unit, and the project consultants, by consanguinity or affinity up to the third civil degree. On the part of the Bidder, this Clause shall apply to the following persons:
 - (a) If the Bidder is an individual or a sole proprietorship, to the Bidder himself;
 - (b) If the Bidder is a partnership, to all its officers and members;
 - (c) If the Bidder is a corporation, to all its officers, directors, and controlling stockholders;
 - (d) If the Bidder is a cooperative, to all its officers, directors, and controlling shareholders or members; and

(e) If the Bidder is a joint venture (JV), the provisions of items (a), (b), (c), or (d) of this Clause shall correspondingly apply to each of the members of the said JV, as may be appropriate.

Relationship of the nature described above or failure to comply with this Clause will result in the automatic disqualification of a Bidder.

5. Eligible Bidders

- 5.1. Unless otherwise provided in the **BDS**, the following persons shall be eligible to participate in this bidding:
 - (a) Duly licensed Filipino citizens/sole proprietorships;
 - (b) Partnerships duly organized under the laws of the Philippines and of which at least sixty percent (60%) of the interest belongs to citizens of the Philippines;
 - (c) Corporations duly organized under the laws of the Philippines, and of which at least sixty percent (60%) of the outstanding capital stock belongs to citizens of the Philippines;
 - (d) Cooperatives duly organized under the laws of the Philippines; and
 - (e) Persons/entities forming themselves into a Joint Venture (JV), *i.e.*, a group of two (2) or more persons/entities that intend to be jointly and severally responsible or liable for a particular contract: Provided, however, that Filipino ownership or interest of the JV concerned shall be at least sixty percent (60%).
- 5.2. Foreign bidders may be eligible to participate when any of the following circumstances exist, as specified in the **BDS**:
 - (a) When a Treaty or International or Executive Agreement as provided in Section 4 of RA 9184 and its IRR allow foreign bidders to participate;
 - (b) Citizens, corporations, or associations of a country, the laws or regulations of which grant reciprocal rights or privileges to citizens, corporations, or associations of the Philippines;
 - (c) When the Goods sought to be procured are not available from local suppliers; or
 - (d) When there is a need to prevent situations that defeat competition or restrain trade.
- 5.3. Government owned or -controlled corporations (GOCCs) may be eligible to participate only if they can establish that they (a) are legally and financially autonomous, (b) operate under commercial law, and (c) are not attached agencies of the Procuring Entity.

5.4. Unless otherwise provided in the **BDS**, the Bidder must have completed a Single Largest Completed Contract (SLCC) similar to the Project and the value of which, adjusted, if necessary, by the Bidder to current prices using the Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA) consumer price index, must be at least equivalent to a percentage of the ABC stated in the **BDS**.

For this purpose, contracts similar to the Project shall be those described in the **BDS**, and completed within the relevant period stated in the Invitation to Bid and **ITB** Clause 12.1(a)(ii).

5.5. The Bidder must submit a computation of its Net Financial Contracting Capacity (NFCC), which must be at least equal to the ABC to be bid, calculated as follows:

NFCC = [(Current assets minus current liabilities) (15)] minus the value of all outstanding or uncompleted portions of the projects under ongoing contracts, including awarded contracts yet to be started, coinciding with the contract to be bid.

The values of the domestic bidder's current assets and current liabilities shall be based on the latest Audited Financial Statements submitted to the BIR.

For purposes of computing the foreign bidders' NFCC, the value of the current assets and current liabilities shall be based on their audited financial statements prepared in accordance with international financial reporting standards.

If the prospective bidder opts to submit a committed Line of Credit, it must be at least equal to ten percent (10%) of the ABC to be bid. If issued by a foreign universal or commercial bank, it shall be confirmed or authenticated by a local universal or commercial bank.

6. Bidder's Responsibilities

- 6.1. The Bidder or its duly authorized representative shall submit a sworn statement in the form prescribed in Section VIII. Bidding Forms as required in ITB Clause 12.1(b)(iii).
- 6.2. The Bidder is responsible for the following:
 - (a) Having taken steps to carefully examine all of the Bidding Documents;
 - (b) Having acknowledged all conditions, local or otherwise, affecting the implementation of the contract;
 - (c) Having made an estimate of the facilities available and needed for the contract to be bid, if any;
 - (d) Having complied with its responsibility to inquire or secure Supplemental/Bid Bulletin(s) as provided under ITB Clause 10.4.

- (a) Ensuring that it is not "blacklisted" or barred from bidding by the GOP or any of its agencies, offices, corporations, or LGUs, including foreign government/foreign or international financing institution whose blacklisting rules have been recognized by the GPPB;
- (b) Ensuring that each of the documents submitted in satisfaction of the bidding requirements is an authentic copy of the original, complete, and all statements and information provided therein are true and correct;
- (c) Authorizing the HoPE or its duly authorized representative/s to verify all the documents submitted;
- (d) Ensuring that the signatory is the duly authorized representative of the Bidder, and granted full power and authority to do, execute and perform any and all acts necessary and/or to represent the Bidder in the bidding, with the duly notarized Secretary's Certificate attesting to such fact, if the Bidder is a corporation, partnership, cooperative, or joint venture;
- (e) Complying with the disclosure provision under Section 47 of RA 9184 and its IRR in relation to other provisions of RA 3019;
- (f) Complying with existing labor laws and standards, in the case of procurement of services; Moreover, bidder undertakes to:
 - (i) Ensure the entitlement of workers to wages, hours of work, safety and health and other prevailing conditions of work as established by national laws, rules and regulations; or collective bargaining agreement; or arbitration award, if and when applicable.

In case there is a finding by the Procuring Entity or the DOLE of underpayment or non-payment of workers' wage and wage-related benefits, bidder agrees that the performance security or portion of the contract amount shall be withheld in favor of the complaining workers pursuant to appropriate provisions of Republic Act No. 9184 without prejudice to the institution of appropriate actions under the Labor Code, as amended, and other social legislations.

(ii) Comply with occupational safety and health standards and to correct deficiencies, if any.

In case of imminent danger, injury or death of the worker, bidder undertakes to suspend contract implementation pending clearance to proceed from the DOLE Regional Office and to comply with Work Stoppage Order; and

- (iii) Inform the workers of their conditions of work, labor clauses under the contract specifying wages, hours of work and other benefits under prevailing national laws, rules and regulations; or collective bargaining agreement; or arbitration award, if and when applicable, through posting in two (2) conspicuous places in the establishment's premises; and
- (g) Ensuring that it did not give or pay, directly or indirectly, any commission, amount, fee, or any form of consideration, pecuniary or otherwise, to any person or official, personnel or representative of the government in relation to any procurement project or activity.

Failure to observe any of the above responsibilities shall be at the risk of the Bidder concerned.

- 6.3. The Bidder is expected to examine all instructions, forms, terms, and specifications in the Bidding Documents.
- 6.4. It shall be the sole responsibility of the Bidder to determine and to satisfy itself by such means as it considers necessary or desirable as to all matters pertaining to the contract to be bid, including: (a) the location and the nature of this Project; (b) climatic conditions; (c) transportation facilities; and (d) other factors that may affect the cost, duration, and execution or implementation of this Project.
- 6.5. The Procuring Entity shall not assume any responsibility regarding erroneous interpretations or conclusions by the prospective or eligible bidder out of the data furnished by the procuring entity. However, the Procuring Entity shall ensure that all information in the Bidding Documents, including bid/supplemental bid bulletin/s issued, are correct and consistent.
- 6.6. Before submitting their bids, the Bidder is deemed to have become familiar with all existing laws, decrees, ordinances, acts and regulations of the Philippines which may affect this Project in any way.
- 6.7. The Bidder shall bear all costs associated with the preparation and submission of his bid, and the Procuring Entity will in no case be responsible or liable for those costs, regardless of the conduct or outcome of the bidding process.
- 6.8. The Bidder should note that the Procuring Entity will accept bids only from those that have paid the applicable fee for the Bidding Documents at the office indicated in the Invitation to Bid.

7. Origin of Goods

Unless otherwise indicated in the **BDS**, there is no restriction on the origin of goods other than those prohibited by a decision of the United Nations Security Council taken under Chapter VII of the Charter of the United Nations, subject to **ITB** Clause 27.1.

8. Subcontracts

- 8.1. Unless otherwise specified in the **BDS**, the Bidder may subcontract portions of the Goods to an extent as may be approved by the Procuring Entity and stated in the **BDS**. However, subcontracting of any portion shall not relieve the Bidder from any liability or obligation that may arise from the contract for this Project.
- 8.2. Subcontractors must submit the documentary requirements under ITB Clause 12 and comply with the eligibility criteria specified in the <u>BDS</u>. In the event that any subcontractor is found by the Procuring Entity to be ineligible, the subcontracting of such portion of the Goods shall be disallowed.
- 8.3. The Bidder may identify the subcontractor to whom a portion of the Goods will be subcontracted at any stage of the bidding process or during contract implementation. If the Bidder opts to disclose the name of the subcontractor during bid submission, the Bidder shall include the required documents as part of the technical component of its bid.

B. Contents of Bidding Documents

9. Pre-Bid Conference

- 9.1. (a) If so specified in the **BDS**, a pre-bid conference shall be held at the venue and on the date indicated therein, to clarify and address the Bidders' questions on the technical and financial components of this Project.
 - (b) The pre-bid conference shall be held at least twelve (12) calendar days before the deadline for the submission and receipt of bids, but not earlier than seven (7) calendar days from the posting of the invitation to bid/bidding documents in the PhilGEPS website. If the Procuring Entity determines that, by reason of the method, nature, or complexity of the contract to be bid, or when international participation will be more advantageous to the GOP, a longer period for the preparation of bids is necessary, the pre-bid conference shall be held at least thirty (30) calendar days before the deadline for the submission and receipt of bids, as specified in the **BDS**.
- 9.2. Bidders are encouraged to attend the pre-bid conference to ensure that they fully understand the Procuring Entity's requirements. Non-attendance of the Bidder will in no way prejudice its bid; however, the Bidder is expected to know the changes and/or amendments to the Bidding Documents as recorded in the minutes of the pre-bid conference and the Supplemental/Bid Bulletin. The minutes of the pre-bid conference shall be recorded and prepared not later than five (5) calendar days after the pre-bid conference. The minutes shall be made available to prospective bidders not later than five (5) days upon written request.
- 9.3 Decisions of the BAC amending any provision of the bidding documents shall be issued in writing through a Supplemental/Bid Bulletin at least seven (7) calendar days before the deadline for the submission and receipt of bids.

10. Clarification and Amendment of Bidding Documents

- 10.1. Prospective bidders may request for clarification on and/or interpretation of any part of the Bidding Documents. Such requests must be in writing and submitted to the Procuring Entity at the address indicated in the **BDS** at least ten (10) calendar days before the deadline set for the submission and receipt of Bids.
- 10.2. The BAC shall respond to the said request by issuing a Supplemental/Bid Bulletin, to be made available to all those who have properly secured the Bidding Documents, at least seven (7) calendar days before the deadline for the submission and receipt of Bids.
- 10.3. Supplemental/Bid Bulletins may also be issued upon the Procuring Entity's initiative for purposes of clarifying or modifying any provision of the Bidding Documents not later than seven (7) calendar days before the deadline for the submission and receipt of Bids. Any modification to the Bidding Documents shall be identified as an amendment.
- 10.4. Any Supplemental/Bid Bulletin issued by the BAC shall also be posted in the PhilGEPS and the website of the Procuring Entity concerned, if available, and at any conspicuous place in the premises of the Procuring Entity concerned. It shall be the responsibility of all Bidders who have properly secured the Bidding Documents to inquire and secure Supplemental/Bid Bulletins that may be issued by the BAC. However, Bidders who have submitted bids before the issuance of the Supplemental/Bid Bulletin must be informed and allowed to modify or withdraw their bids in accordance with ITB Clause 23.

C. Preparation of Bids

11. Language of Bids

The eligibility requirements or statements, the bids, and all other documents to be submitted to the BAC must be in English. If the eligibility requirements or statements, the bids, and all other documents submitted to the BAC are in foreign language other than English, it must be accompanied by a translation of the documents in English. The documents shall be translated by the relevant foreign government agency, the foreign government agency authorized to translate documents, or a registered translator in the foreign bidder's country; and shall be authenticated by the appropriate Philippine foreign service establishment/post or the equivalent office having jurisdiction over the foreign bidder's affairs in the Philippines. The English translation shall govern, for purposes of interpretation of the bid.

12. Documents Comprising the Bid: Eligibility and Technical Components

- 12.1. Unless otherwise indicated in the **BDS**, the first envelope shall contain the following eligibility and technical documents:
 - (a) Eligibility Documents –

Class "A" Documents:

- (i) PhilGEPS Certificate of Registration and Membership in accordance with Section 8.5.2 of the IRR, except for foreign bidders participating in the procurement by a Philippine Foreign Service Office or Post, which shall submit their eligibility documents under Section 23.1 of the IRR, provided, that the winning bidder shall register with the PhilGEPS in accordance with section 37.1.4 of the IRR.
- (ii) Statement of all its ongoing government and private contracts, including contracts awarded but not yet started, if any, whether similar or not similar in nature and complexity to the contract to be bid; and

Statement of the Bidder's SLCC similar to the contract to be bid, in accordance with ITB Clause 5.4, within the relevant period as provided in the **BDS**.

The two statements required shall indicate for each contract the following:

- (ii.1) name of the contract;
- (ii.2) date of the contract;
- (ii.3) contract duration;
- (ii.4) owner's name and address:
- (ii.5) kinds of Goods;
- (ii.6) For Statement of Ongoing Contracts amount of contract and value of outstanding contracts;
- (ii.7) For Statement of SLCC amount of completed contracts, adjusted by the Bidder to current prices using PSA's consumer price index, if necessary for the purpose of meeting the SLCC requirement;
- (ii.8) date of delivery; and
- (ii.9) end user's acceptance or official receipt(s) or sales invoice issued for the contract, if completed, which shall be attached to the statements.
- (iii) NFCC computation in accordance with ITB Clause 5.5 or a committed Line of Credit from a universal or commercial bank.

Class "B" Document:

(iv) If applicable, the Joint Venture Agreement (JVA) in case the joint venture is already in existence, or duly notarized statements from all the potential joint venture partners in accordance with Section 23.1(b) of the IRR.

(b) Technical Documents -

- (i) Bid security in accordance with **ITB** Clause 18. If the Bidder opts to submit the bid security in the form of:
 - (i.1) a bank draft/guarantee or an irrevocable letter of credit issued by a foreign bank, it shall be accompanied by a confirmation from a Universal or Commercial Bank; or
 - (i.2) a surety bond, it shall be accompanied by a certification by the Insurance Commission that the surety or insurance company is authorized to issue such instruments;
- (ii) Conformity with technical specifications, as enumerated and specified in Sections VI and VII of the Bidding Documents; and
- (iii) Sworn statement in accordance with Section 25.3 of the IRR of RA 9184 and using the form prescribed in Section VIII. Bidding Forms.
- (iv) For foreign bidders claiming eligibility by reason of their country's extension of reciprocal rights to Filipinos, a certification from the relevant government office of their country stating that Filipinos are allowed to participate in their government procurement activities for the same item or product.

13. Documents Comprising the Bid: Financial Component

- 13.1. Unless otherwise stated in the **BDS**, the financial component of the bid shall contain the following:
 - (a) Financial Bid Form, which includes bid prices and the applicable Price Schedules, in accordance with **ITB** Clauses 15.1 and 15.4;
 - (b) If the Bidder claims preference as a Domestic Bidder, a certification from the DTI issued in accordance with **ITB** Clause 27, unless otherwise provided in the **BDS**; and
 - (c) Any other document related to the financial component of the bid as stated in the **BDS**.
- 13.2. (a) Unless otherwise stated in the **BDS**, all bids that exceed the ABC shall not be accepted.

- (b) Unless otherwise indicated in the **BDS**, for foreign-funded procurement, a ceiling may be applied to bid prices provided the following conditions are met:
 - (i) Bidding Documents are obtainable free of charge on a freely accessible website. If payment of Bidding Documents is required by the procuring entity, payment could be made upon the submission of bids.
 - (ii) The procuring entity has procedures in place to ensure that the ABC is based on recent estimates made by the responsible unit of the procuring entity and that the estimates reflect the quality, supervision and risk and inflationary factors, as well as prevailing market prices, associated with the types of works or goods to be procured.
 - (iii) The procuring entity has trained cost estimators on estimating prices and analyzing bid variances.
 - (iv) The procuring entity has established a system to monitor and report bid prices relative to ABC and engineer's/procuring entity's estimate.
 - (v) The procuring entity has established a monitoring and evaluation system for contract implementation to provide feedback on actual total costs of goods and works.
- 13.3. Financial proposals for single or multi-year Framework Agreement shall be submitted before the deadline of submission of bids as prescribed in the IB. For multi-year Framework Agreement, evaluation of the financial proposal during this stage is for purposes of determining eligibility and whether or not such financial proposal is within the ABC.

14. Alternative Bids

- 14.1 Alternative Bids shall be rejected. For this purpose, an alternative bid is an offer made by a Bidder in addition or as a substitute to its original bid which may be included as part of its original bid or submitted separately therewith for purposes of bidding. A bid with options is considered an alternative bid regardless of whether said bid proposal is contained in a single envelope or submitted in two (2) or more separate bid envelopes.
- 14.2 Each Bidder shall submit only one Bid, either individually or as a partner in a JV. A Bidder who submits or participates in more than one bid (other than as a subcontractor if a subcontractor is permitted to participate in more than one bid) will cause all the proposals with the Bidder's participation to be disqualified. This shall be without prejudice to any applicable criminal, civil and administrative penalties that may be imposed upon the persons and entities concerned.

15. Bid Prices

- 15.1. The Bidder shall complete the appropriate Schedule of Prices included herein, stating the unit prices, total price per item, the total amount and the expected countries of origin of the Goods to be supplied under this Project.
- 15.2. The Bidder shall fill in rates and prices for all items of the Goods described in the Schedule of Prices. Bids not addressing or providing all of the required items in the Bidding Documents including, where applicable, Schedule of Prices, shall be considered non-responsive and, thus, automatically disqualified. In this regard, where a required item is provided, but no price is indicated, the same shall be considered as non-responsive, but specifying a zero (0) or a dash (-) for the said item would mean that it is being offered for free to the Government, except those required by law or regulations to be accomplished.
- 15.3. The terms Ex Works (EXW), Cost, Insurance and Freight (CIF), Cost and Insurance Paid to (CIP), Delivered Duty Paid (DDP), and other trade terms used to describe the obligations of the parties, shall be governed by the rules prescribed in the current edition of the International Commercial Terms (INCOTERMS) published by the International Chamber of Commerce, Paris.
- 15.4. Prices indicated on the Price Schedule shall be entered separately in the following manner:
 - (a) For Goods offered from within the Procuring Entity's country:
 - (i) The price of the Goods quoted EXW (ex works, ex factory, ex warehouse, ex showroom, or off-the-shelf, as applicable);
 - (ii) The cost of all customs duties and sales and other taxes already paid or payable;
 - (iii) The cost of transportation, insurance, and other costs incidental to delivery of the Goods to their final destination; and
 - (iv) The price of other (incidental) services, if any, listed in the **BDS**.
 - (b) For Goods offered from abroad:
 - (i) Unless otherwise stated in the **BDS**, the price of the Goods shall be quoted DDP with the place of destination in the Philippines as specified in the **BDS**. In quoting the price, the Bidder shall be free to use transportation through carriers registered in any eligible country. Similarly, the Bidder may obtain insurance services from any eligible source country.
 - (ii) The price of other (incidental) services, if any, listed in the **BDS**.
 - (c) For Services, based on the form which may be prescribed by the Procuring Entity, in accordance with existing laws, rules and regulations

- 15.5. Prices quoted by the Bidder shall be fixed during the Bidder's performance of the contract and not subject to variation or price escalation on any account. A bid submitted with an adjustable price quotation shall be treated as non-responsive and shall be rejected, pursuant to **ITB** Clause 24.
- 15.6. For Framework Agreement, the following should also apply in addition to Clause 15.4:
 - (a) For a single year Framework Agreement, the prices quoted by the Bidder shall be fixed during the Bidder's performance of the contract and not subject to variation or escalation on any account. Price schedules required under Clause 15.4 shall be submitted with the bidding documents.

16. Bid Currencies

- 16.1. Prices shall be quoted in the following currencies:
 - (a) For Goods that the Bidder will supply from within the Philippines, the prices shall be quoted in Philippine Pesos.
 - (b) For Goods that the Bidder will supply from outside the Philippines, the prices may be quoted in the currency(ies) stated in the **BDS**. However, for purposes of bid evaluation, bids denominated in foreign currencies shall be converted to Philippine currency based on the exchange rate as published in the *Bangko Sentral ng Pilipinas* (BSP) reference rate bulletin on the day of the bid opening.
- 16.2. If so allowed in accordance with **ITB** Clause 16.1, the Procuring Entity for purposes of bid evaluation and comparing the bid prices will convert the amounts in various currencies in which the bid price is expressed to Philippine Pesos at the foregoing exchange rates.
- 16.3. Unless otherwise specified in the <u>BDS</u>, payment of the contract price shall be made in Philippine Pesos.

17. Bid Validity

- 17.1. Bids shall remain valid for the period specified in the **BDS** which shall not exceed one hundred twenty (120) calendar days from the date of the opening of bids.
- 17.2. In exceptional circumstances, prior to the expiration of the bid validity period, the Procuring Entity may request Bidders to extend the period of validity of their bids. The request and the responses shall be made in writing. The bid security described in ITB Clause 18 should also be extended corresponding to the extension of the bid validity period at the least. A Bidder may refuse the request without forfeiting its bid security, but his bid shall no longer be considered for further evaluation and award. A Bidder granting the request shall not be required or permitted to modify its bid.

18. Bid Security

18.1. The Bidder shall submit a Bid Securing Declaration or any form of Bid Security in the amount stated in the **BDS**, which shall be not less than the percentage of the ABC in accordance with the following schedule:

(a) Cash or cashier's/manager's check issued by a Universal or Commercial Bank. For biddings conducted by LGUs, the Cashier's/Manager's Check may be issued by other banks certified by the BSP as authorized to issue such financial instrument.	
(b) Bank draft/guarantee or irrevocable letter of credit issued by a Universal or Commercial Bank: Provided, however, that it shall be confirmed or authenticated by a Universal or Commercial Bank, if issued by a foreign bank.	Two percent (2%)
For biddings conducted by LGUs, Bank Draft/Guarantee, or Irrevocable Letter of Credit may be issued by other banks certified by the BSP as authorized to issue such financial instrument.	
(c) Surety bond callable upon demand issued by a surety or insurance company duly certified by the Insurance Commission as authorized to issue such security.	Five percent (5%)

The Bid Securing Declaration mentioned above is an undertaking which states, among others, that the Bidder shall enter into contract with the procuring entity and furnish the performance security required under ITB Clause 33.2, within ten (10) calendar days from receipt of the Notice of Award, and commits to pay the corresponding amount as fine, and be suspended for a period of time from being qualified to participate in any government procurement activity in the event it violates any of the conditions stated therein as provided in the guidelines issued by the GPPB.

- 18.2. The bid security should be valid for the period specified in the **BDS**. Any bid not accompanied by an acceptable bid security shall be rejected by the Procuring Entity as non-responsive.
- 18.3. No bid securities shall be returned to Bidders after the opening of bids and before contract signing, except to those that failed or declared as post-disqualified, upon submission of a written waiver of their right to file a request for reconsideration and/or protest, or upon the lapse of the reglementary period to file a request for reconsideration or protest. Without prejudice on its forfeiture, bid securities shall be returned only after the Bidder with the Lowest Calculated Responsive Bid (LCRB) has signed the contract and furnished the performance security, but in no case later than the expiration of the bid security validity period indicated in ITB Clause 18.2.
- 18.4. Upon signing and execution of the contract pursuant to **ITB** Clause 32, and the posting of the performance security pursuant to **ITB** Clause 33, the successful Bidder's bid security will be discharged, but in no case later than the bid security validity period as indicated in the **ITB** Clause 18.2.
- 18.5. The bid security may be forfeited:
 - (a) if a Bidder:
 - (i) withdraws its bid during the period of bid validity specified in ITB Clause 17;
 - (ii) does not accept the correction of errors pursuant to ITB Clause 28.3(b);
 - (iii) has a finding against the veracity of any of the documents submitted as stated in ITB Clause 29.2;
 - (iv) submission of eligibility requirements containing false information or falsified documents:
 - submission of bids that contain false information or falsified documents, or the concealment of such information in the bids in order to influence the outcome of eligibility screening or any other stage of the public bidding;
 - (vi) allowing the use of one's name, or using the name of another for purposes of public bidding;
 - (vii) withdrawal of a bid, or refusal to accept an award, or enter into contract with the Government without justifiable cause, after the Bidder had been adjudged as having submitted the LCRB;
 - (viii) refusal or failure to post the required performance security within the prescribed time;

- (ix) refusal to clarify or validate in writing its bid during postqualification within a period of seven (7) calendar days from receipt of the request for clarification;
- (x) any documented attempt by a Bidder to unduly influence the outcome of the bidding in his favor;
- (xi) failure of the potential joint venture partners to enter into the joint venture after the bid is declared successful; or
- (xii) all other acts that tend to defeat the purpose of the competitive bidding, such as habitually withdrawing from bidding, submitting late Bids or patently insufficient bid, for at least three (3) times within a year, except for valid reasons.
- (b) if the successful Bidder:
 - (i) fails to sign the contract in accordance with ITB Clause 32; or
 - (ii) fails to furnish performance security in accordance with **ITB** Clause 33.
- 18.6. In case of Framework Agreement, other than the grounds for forfeiture under the 2016 revised IRR, the bid security may also be forfeited if the successful bidder fails to sign the Framework Agreement, or fails to furnish the performance security or performance securing declaration. Without prejudice on its forfeiture, bid securities shall be returned only after the posting of performance security or performance securing declaration, as the case may be, by the winning Bidder or compliant Bidders and the signing of the Framework Agreement.

19. Format and Signing of Bids

- 19.1. Bidders shall submit their bids through their duly authorized representative using the appropriate forms provided in Section VIII. Bidding Forms on or before the deadline specified in the ITB Clauses 21 in two (2) separate sealed bid envelopes, and which shall be submitted simultaneously. The first shall contain the technical component of the bid, including the eligibility requirements under ITB Clause 12.1, and the second shall contain the financial component of the bid. This shall also be observed for each lot in the case of lot procurement.
- 19.2. Forms as mentioned in **ITB** Clause 19.1 must be completed without any alterations to their format, and no substitute form shall be accepted. All blank spaces shall be filled in with the information requested.
- 19.3. The Bidder shall prepare and submit an original of the first and second envelopes as described in **ITB** Clauses 12 and 13. In addition, the Bidder shall submit copies of the first and second envelopes. In the event of any discrepancy between the original and the copies, the original shall prevail.

- 19.4. Each and every page of the Bid Form, including the Schedule of Prices, under Section VIII hereof, shall be signed by the duly authorized representative/s of the Bidder. Failure to do so shall be a ground for the rejection of the bid.
- 19.5. Any interlineations, erasures, or overwriting shall be valid only if they are signed or initialed by the duly authorized representative/s of the Bidder.

20. Sealing and Marking of Bids

- 20.1. Bidders shall enclose their original eligibility and technical documents described in ITB Clause 12 in one sealed envelope marked "ORIGINAL TECHNICAL COMPONENT", and the original of their financial component in another sealed envelope marked "ORIGINAL FINANCIAL COMPONENT", sealing them all in an outer envelope marked "ORIGINAL BID".
- 20.2. Each copy of the first and second envelopes shall be similarly sealed duly marking the inner envelopes as "COPY NO. ___ TECHNICAL COMPONENT" and "COPY NO. ___ FINANCIAL COMPONENT" and the outer envelope as "COPY NO. ___ ", respectively. These envelopes containing the original and the copies shall then be enclosed in one single envelope.
- 20.3. The original and the number of copies of the Bid as indicated in the **BDS** shall be typed or written in ink and shall be signed by the Bidder or its duly authorized representative/s.
- 20.4. All envelopes shall:
 - (a) contain the name of the contract to be bid in capital letters;
 - (b) bear the name and address of the Bidder in capital letters;
 - (c) be addressed to the Procuring Entity's BAC in accordance with **ITB** Clause 1.1;
 - (d) bear the specific identification of this bidding process indicated in the ITB Clause 1.2; and
 - (e) bear a warning "DO NOT OPEN BEFORE..." the date and time for the opening of bids, in accordance with **ITB** Clause 21.
- 20.5. Bid envelopes that are not properly sealed and marked, as required in the bidding documents, shall not be rejected, but the Bidder or its duly authorized representative shall acknowledge such condition of the bid as submitted. The BAC or the Procuring Entity shall assume no responsibility for the misplacement of the contents of the improperly sealed or marked bid, or for its premature opening.

D. Submission and Opening of Bids

21. Deadline for Submission of Bids

Bids must be received by the Procuring Entity's BAC at the address and on or before the date and time indicated in the **BDS**.

22. Late Bids

Any bid submitted after the deadline for submission and receipt of bids prescribed by the Procuring Entity, pursuant to **ITB** Clause 21, shall be declared "Late" and shall not be accepted by the Procuring Entity. The BAC shall record in the minutes of bid submission and opening, the Bidder's name, its representative and the time the late bid was submitted.

23. Modification and Withdrawal of Bids

- 23.1. The Bidder may modify its bid after it has been submitted; provided that the modification is received by the Procuring Entity prior to the deadline prescribed for submission and receipt of bids. The Bidder shall not be allowed to retrieve its original bid, but shall be allowed to submit another bid equally sealed and properly identified in accordance with ITB Clause 20, linked to its original bid marked as "TECHNICAL MODIFICATION" or "FINANCIAL MODIFICATION" and stamped "received" by the BAC. Bid modifications received after the applicable deadline shall not be considered and shall be returned to the Bidder unopened.
- 23.2. A Bidder may, through a Letter of Withdrawal, withdraw its bid after it has been submitted, for valid and justifiable reason; provided that the Letter of Withdrawal is received by the Procuring Entity prior to the deadline prescribed for submission and receipt of bids. The Letter of Withdrawal must be executed by the duly authorized representative of the Bidder identified in the Omnibus Sworn Statement, a copy of which should be attached to the letter.
- 23.3. Bids requested to be withdrawn in accordance with ITB Clause 23.1 shall be returned unopened to the Bidders. A Bidder, who has acquired the bidding documents, may also express its intention not to participate in the bidding through a letter which should reach and be stamped by the BAC before the deadline for submission and receipt of bids. A Bidder that withdraws its bid shall not be permitted to submit another bid, directly or indirectly, for the same contract.
- 23.4. No bid may be modified after the deadline for submission of bids. No bid may be withdrawn in the interval between the deadline for submission of bids and the expiration of the period of bid validity specified by the Bidder on the Financial Bid Form. Withdrawal of a bid during this interval shall result in the forfeiture of the Bidder's bid security, pursuant to ITB Clause 18.5, and the imposition of administrative, civil and criminal sanctions as prescribed by RA 9184 and its IRR.

24. Opening and Preliminary Examination of Bids

- 24.1. The BAC shall open the bids in public, immediately after the deadline for the submission and receipt of bids, as specified in the **BDS**. In case the Bids cannot be opened as scheduled due to justifiable reasons, the BAC shall take custody of the Bids submitted and reschedule the opening of Bids on the next working day or at the soonest possible time through the issuance of a Notice of Postponement to be posted in the PhilGEPS website and the website of the Procuring Entity concerned.
- 24.2. Unless otherwise specified in the **BDS**, the BAC shall open the first bid envelopes and determine each Bidder's compliance with the documents prescribed in **ITB** Clause 12, using a non-discretionary "pass/fail" criterion. If a Bidder submits the required document, it shall be rated "passed" for that particular requirement. In this regard, bids that fail to include any requirement or are incomplete or patently insufficient shall be considered as "failed". Otherwise, the BAC shall rate the said first bid envelope as "passed".
- 24.3. Unless otherwise specified in the <u>BDS</u>, immediately after determining compliance with the requirements in the first envelope, the BAC shall forthwith open the second bid envelope of each remaining eligible bidder whose first bid envelope was rated "passed". The second envelope of each complying bidder shall be opened within the same day. In case one or more of the requirements in the second envelope of a particular bid is missing, incomplete or patently insufficient, and/or if the submitted total bid price exceeds the ABC unless otherwise provided in ITB Clause 13.2, the BAC shall rate the bid concerned as "failed". Only bids that are determined to contain all the bid requirements for both components shall be rated "passed" and shall immediately be considered for evaluation and comparison.
- 24.4. Letters of Withdrawal shall be read out and recorded during bid opening, and the envelope containing the corresponding withdrawn bid shall be returned to the Bidder unopened.
- 24.5. All members of the BAC who are present during bid opening shall initial every page of the original copies of all bids received and opened.
- 24.6. In the case of an eligible foreign bidder as described in ITB Clause 5, the following Class "A" Documents may be substituted with the appropriate equivalent documents, if any, issued by the country of the foreign Bidder concerned, which shall likewise be uploaded and maintained in the PhilGEPS in accordance with Section 8.5.2 of the IRR:
 - (a) Registration certificate from the Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC), Department of Trade and Industry (DTI) for sole proprietorship, or CDA for cooperatives;
 - (b) Mayor's/Business permit issued by the local government where the principal place of business of the bidder is located; and

- (c) Audited Financial Statements showing, among others, the prospective bidder's total and current assets and liabilities stamped "received" by the Bureau of Internal Revenue or its duly accredited and authorized institutions, for the preceding calendar year which should not be earlier than two years from the date of bid submission.
- 24.7. Each partner of a joint venture agreement shall likewise submit the requirements in **ITB** Clause 12.1(a)(i). Submission of documents required under **ITB** Clauses 12.1(a)(ii) to 12.1(a)(iii) by any of the joint venture partners constitutes compliance.
- 24.8. The Procuring Entity shall prepare the minutes of the proceedings of the bid opening that shall include, as a minimum: (a) names of Bidders, their bid price (per lot, if applicable, and/or including discount, if any), bid security, findings of preliminary examination, and whether there is a withdrawal or modification; and (b) attendance sheet. The BAC members shall sign the abstract of bids as read.

The bidders or their duly authorized representatives may attend the opening of bids. The BAC shall ensure the integrity, security, and confidentiality of all submitted bids. The Abstract of Bids as read and the minutes of the bid opening shall be made available to the public upon written request and payment of a specified fee to recover cost of materials.

24.9 To ensure transparency and accurate representation of the bid submission, the BAC Secretariat shall notify in writing all bidders whose bids it has received through its PhilGEPS-registered physical address or official e-mail address. The notice shall be issued within seven (7) calendar days from the date of the bid opening.

E. Evaluation and Comparison of Bids

25. Process to be Confidential

- 25.1. Members of the BAC, including its staff and personnel, as well as its Secretariat and TWG, are prohibited from making or accepting any kind of communication with any bidder regarding the evaluation of their bids until the issuance of the Notice of Award, unless otherwise allowed in the case of ITB Clause 26.
- 25.2. Any effort by a bidder to influence the Procuring Entity in the Procuring Entity's decision in respect of bid evaluation, bid comparison or contract award will result in the rejection of the Bidder's bid.

26. Clarification of Bids

To assist in the evaluation, comparison, and post-qualification of the bids, the Procuring Entity may ask in writing any Bidder for a clarification of its bid. All responses to requests for clarification shall be in writing. Any clarification submitted

by a Bidder in respect to its bid and that is not in response to a request by the Procuring Entity shall not be considered.

27. Domestic Preference

- 27.1. Unless otherwise stated in the **BDS**, the Procuring Entity will grant a margin of preference for the purpose of comparison of bids in accordance with the following:
 - (a) The preference shall be applied when the lowest Foreign Bid is lower than the lowest bid offered by a Domestic Bidder.
 - (b) For evaluation purposes, the lowest Foreign Bid shall be increased by fifteen percent (15%).
 - (c) In the event that the lowest bid offered by a Domestic Bidder does not exceed the lowest Foreign Bid as increased, then the Procuring Entity shall award the contract to the Domestic Bidder at the amount of the lowest Foreign Bid.
 - (d) If the Domestic Bidder refuses to accept the award of contract at the amount of the Foreign Bid within two (2) calendar days from receipt of written advice from the BAC, the Procuring Entity shall award to the bidder offering the Foreign Bid, subject to post-qualification and submission of all the documentary requirements under these Bidding Documents.
- 27.2. A Bidder may be granted preference as a Domestic Bidder subject to the certification from the DTI that the Bidder is offering unmanufactured articles, materials or supplies of the growth or production of the Philippines, or manufactured articles, materials, or supplies manufactured or to be manufactured in the Philippines substantially from articles, materials, or supplies of the growth, production, or manufacture, as the case may be, of the Philippines.

28. Detailed Evaluation and Comparison of Bids

28.1. The Procuring Entity will undertake the detailed evaluation and comparison of bids which have passed the opening and preliminary examination of bids, pursuant to **ITB** Clause 24, in order to determine the Lowest Calculated Bid.

In the case of Single-year Framework Agreement, the Lowest Calculated Bid shall be determined outright after the detailed evaluation.

- 28.2. The Lowest Calculated Bid shall be determined in two steps:
 - (a) The detailed evaluation of the financial component of the bids, to establish the correct calculated prices of the bids; and

- (b) The ranking of the total bid prices is calculated from the lowest to the highest. The bid with the lowest price shall be identified as the Lowest Calculated Bid.
- 28.3. The Procuring Entity's BAC shall immediately conduct a detailed evaluation of all bids rated "passed," using non-discretionary pass/fail criteria. The BAC shall consider the following in the evaluation of bids:
 - (a) Completeness of the bid. Unless the BDS allows partial bids, bids not addressing or providing all of the required items in the Schedule of Requirements including, where applicable, Schedule of Prices, shall be considered non-responsive and, thus, automatically disqualified. In this regard, where a required item is provided, but no price is indicated, the same shall be considered as non-responsive, but specifying a zero (0) or a dash (-) for the said item would mean that it is being offered for free to the Procuring Entity, except those required by law or regulations to be provided for; and
 - (b) <u>Arithmetical corrections.</u> Consider computational errors and omissions to enable proper comparison of all eligible bids. It may also consider bid modifications. Any adjustment shall be calculated in monetary terms to determine the calculated prices.
- 28.4. Based on the detailed evaluation of bids, those that comply with the above-mentioned requirements shall be ranked in the ascending order of their total calculated bid prices, as evaluated and corrected for computational errors, discounts and other modifications, to identify the Lowest Calculated Bid. Total calculated bid prices, as evaluated and corrected for computational errors, discounts and other modifications, which exceed the ABC shall not be considered, unless otherwise indicated in the **BDS**.
- 28.5. The Procuring Entity's evaluation of bids shall be based on the bid price quoted in the Bid Form, which includes the Schedule of Prices.
- 28.6. Bids shall be evaluated on an equal footing to ensure fair competition. For this purpose, all bidders shall be required to include in their bids the cost of all taxes, such as, but not limited to, value added tax (VAT), income tax, local taxes, and other fiscal levies and duties which shall be itemized in the bid form and reflected in the detailed estimates. Such bids, including said taxes, shall be the basis for bid evaluation and comparison.
- 28.7. If so indicated pursuant to ITB Clause 1.2, Bids are being invited for individual lots or for any combination thereof, provided that all Bids and combinations of Bids shall be received by the same deadline and opened and evaluated simultaneously so as to determine the Bid or combination of Bids offering the lowest calculated cost to the Procuring Entity. Bid prices quoted shall correspond to all items specified for each lot and to all quantities specified for each item of a lot. Bid Security as required by ITB Clause 18 shall be submitted for each contract (lot) separately. The basis for evaluation of lots is specified in BDS Clause 28.3.

28.8. In case a tie among the financial bids is determined, a Post-Qualification Evaluation shall be conducted among the identified bidders to qualify their compliance to the machine technical specification requirements.

After the conduct of the post-qualification evaluation and it has been further determined that there is still a tie among the bids, the Procuring Entity shall exercise a "toss-coin" method to break the tie among the participating bidders.

29. Post-Qualification

- 29.1. The BAC shall determine to its satisfaction whether the Bidder that is evaluated as having submitted the Lowest Calculated Bid complies with and is responsive to all the requirements and conditions specified in **ITB** Clauses 5, 12, and 13.
- 29.2. Within a non-extendible period of five (5) calendar days from receipt by the bidder of the notice from the BAC that it submitted the Lowest Calculated Bid, the Bidder shall submit its latest income and business tax returns filed and paid through the BIR Electronic Filing and Payment System (eFPS) and other appropriate licenses and permits required by law and stated in the **BDS**.

Failure to submit any of the post-qualification requirements on time, or a finding against the veracity thereof, shall disqualify the bidder for award. Provided in the event that a finding against the veracity of any of the documents submitted is made, it shall cause the forfeiture of the bid security in accordance with Section 69 of the IRR of RA 9184.

- 29.3. The determination shall be based upon an examination of the documentary evidence of the Bidder's qualifications submitted pursuant to **ITB** Clauses 12 and 13, as well as other information as the Procuring Entity deems necessary and appropriate, using a non-discretionary "pass/fail" criterion, which shall be completed within a period of twelve (12) calendar days.
- 29.4. If the BAC determines that the Bidder with the Lowest Calculated Bid passes all the criteria for post-qualification, it shall declare the said bid as the LCRB, and recommend to the HoPE the award of contract to the said Bidder at its submitted price or its calculated bid price, whichever is lower.
- 29.5. A negative determination shall result in rejection of the Bidder's Bid, in which event the Procuring Entity shall proceed to the next Lowest Calculated Bid with a fresh period to make a similar determination of that Bidder's capabilities to perform satisfactorily. If the second Bidder, however, fails the post qualification, the procedure for post qualification shall be repeated for the Bidder with the next Lowest Calculated Bid, and so on until the LCRB is determined for recommendation for contract award.
- 29.6. Within a period not exceeding fifteen (15) calendar days from the determination by the BAC of the LCRB and the recommendation to award the contract, the HoPE or his duly authorized representative shall approve or disapprove the said recommendation.

29.7. In the event of disapproval, which shall be based on valid, reasonable, and justifiable grounds as provided for under Section 41 of the IRR of RA 9184, the HoPE shall notify the BAC and the Bidder in writing of such decision and the grounds for it. When applicable, the BAC shall conduct a post-qualification of the Bidder with the next Lowest Calculated Bid. A request for reconsideration may be filed by the bidder with the HoPE in accordance with Section 37.1.3 of the IRR of RA 9184.

30. Reservation Clause

- 30.1. Notwithstanding the eligibility or post-qualification of a Bidder, the Procuring Entity concerned reserves the right to review its qualifications at any stage of the procurement process if it has reasonable grounds to believe that a misrepresentation has been made by the said Bidder, or that there has been a change in the Bidder's capability to undertake the project from the time it submitted its eligibility requirements. Should such review uncover any misrepresentation made in the eligibility and bidding requirements, statements or documents, or any changes in the situation of the Bidder which will affect its capability to undertake the project so that it fails the preset eligibility or bid evaluation criteria, the Procuring Entity shall consider the said Bidder as ineligible and shall disqualify it from submitting a bid or from obtaining an award or contract.
- 30.2. Based on the following grounds, the Procuring Entity reserves the right to reject any and all bids, declare a Failure of Bidding at any time prior to the contract award, or not to award the contract, without thereby incurring any liability, and make no assurance that a contract shall be entered into as a result of the bidding:
 - (a) If there is *prima facie* evidence of collusion between appropriate public officers or employees of the Procuring Entity, or between the BAC and any of the Bidders, or if the collusion is between or among the bidders themselves, or between a Bidder and a third party, including any act which restricts, suppresses or nullifies or tends to restrict, suppress or nullify competition;
 - (b) If the Procuring Entity's BAC is found to have failed in following the prescribed bidding procedures; or
 - (c) For any justifiable and reasonable ground where the award of the contract will not redound to the benefit of the GOP as follows:
 - (i) If the physical and economic conditions have significantly changed so as to render the project no longer economically, financially or technically feasible as determined by the HoPE;
 - (ii) If the project is no longer necessary as determined by the HoPE; and
 - (iii) If the source of funds for the project has been withheld or reduced through no fault of the Procuring Entity.

- 30.3. In addition, the Procuring Entity may likewise declare a failure of bidding when:
 - (a) No bids are received;
 - (b) All prospective Bidders are declared ineligible;
 - (c) All bids fail to comply with all the bid requirements or fail post-qualification; or
 - (d) The bidder with the LCRB refuses, without justifiable cause to accept the award of contract, and no award is made in accordance with Section 40 of the IRR of RA 9184.

F. Award of Contract

31. Contract Award

- 31.1. Subject to **ITB** Clause 29, the HoPE or its duly authorized representative shall award the contract to the Bidder whose bid has been determined to be the LCRB.
- 31.2. Prior to the expiration of the period of bid validity, the Procuring Entity shall notify the successful Bidder in writing that its bid has been accepted, through a Notice of Award duly received by the Bidder or its representative personally or sent by registered mail or electronically, receipt of which must be confirmed in writing within two (2) days by the Bidder with the LCRB and submitted personally or sent by registered mail or electronically to the Procuring Entity.
- 31.3. Notwithstanding the issuance of the Notice of Award, award of contract shall be subject to the following conditions:
 - (a) Submission of the following documents within ten (10) calendar days from receipt of the Notice of Award:
 - (i) Valid JVA, if applicable; or
 - (ii) In the case of procurement by a Philippine Foreign Service Office or Post, the PhilGEPS Registration Number of the winning foreign Bidder;
 - (b) Posting of the performance security in accordance with ITB Clause 33;
 - (c) Signing of the contract as provided in ITB Clause 32; and
 - (d) Approval by higher authority, if required, as provided in Section 37.3 of the IRR of RA 9184.

31.4. At the time of contract award, the Procuring Entity shall not increase or decrease the quantity of goods originally specified in Section VI. Schedule of Requirements.

32. Signing of the Contract

- 32.1. At the same time as the Procuring Entity notifies the successful Bidder that its bid has been accepted, the Procuring Entity shall send the Contract Form to the Bidder, which contract has been provided in the Bidding Documents, incorporating therein all agreements between the parties.
- 32.2. Within ten (10) calendar days from receipt of the Notice of Award, the successful Bidder shall post the required performance security, sign and date the contract and return it to the Procuring Entity.
- 32.3. The Procuring Entity shall enter into contract with the successful Bidder within the same ten (10) calendar day period provided that all the documentary requirements are complied with.
- 32.4. The following documents shall form part of the contract:
 - (a) Contract Agreement;
 - (b) Bidding Documents;
 - (c) Winning bidder's bid, including the Technical and Financial Proposals, and all other documents/statements submitted (e.g., bidder's response to request for clarifications on the bid), including corrections to the bid, if any, resulting from the Procuring Entity's bid evaluation;
 - (d) Performance Security;
 - (e) Notice of Award of Contract; and
 - (f) Other contract documents that may be required by existing laws and/or specified in the **BDS**.
- 32.5. For Single-year Framework Agreement, the Procuring Entity shall send the Framework Agreement Form to the Bidder at the same time as the Procuring Entity notifies the successful Bidder that its bid has been accepted, which contract has been provided in the Bidding Documents, incorporating therein all agreements between the parties.

Within ten (10) calendar days from receipt of the Notice to Executive Framework Agreement with the Procuring Entity, the successful Bidder or its duly authorized representative shall formally enter into a Framework Agreement with the procuring entity for an amount of One Peso to be paid to the procuring entity as a consideration for the option granted by the procuring entity to procure the items in the Framework Agreement List when the need arises.

The Procuring Entity shall enter into a Framework Agreement with the successful Bidder within ten (10) calendar day period provided that all the documentary requirements are complied with.

The following documents shall form part of the Framework Agreement:

- a. Framework Agreement Form;
- b. Bidding Documents;
- c. Call-offs;
- d. Winning bidder's bid, including the Technical and Financial Proposal, and all other documents/statements submitted (e.g., bidder's response to request for clarifications on the bid), including corrections to the bid, if any, resulting from the Procuring Entity's bid evaluation;
- e. Performance Security or Performance Securing Declaration, as the case maybe;
- f. Notice to Execute Framework Agreement; and
- g. Other contract documents that may be required by existing laws and/or specified in the **BDS**.

33. Performance Security

- 33.1. To guarantee the faithful performance by the winning Bidder of its obligations under the contract, it shall post a performance security within a maximum period of ten (10) calendar days from the receipt of the Notice of Award from the Procuring Entity and in no case later than the signing of the contract.
- 33.2. The Performance Security shall be denominated in Philippine Pesos and posted in favor of the Procuring Entity in an amount not less than the percentage of the total contract price in accordance with the following schedule:

33.3. Failure of the successful Bidder to comply with the above-mentioned requirement shall constitute sufficient ground for the annulment of the award and forfeiture of the bid security, in which event the Procuring Entity shall have a fresh period to initiate and complete the post qualification of the second Lowest Calculated Bid. The procedure shall be repeated until the LCRB is identified and selected for recommendation of contract award. However if no Bidder passed post-qualification, the BAC shall declare the bidding a failure and conduct a re-bidding with re-advertisement, if necessary.

34. Notice to Proceed

Within seven (7) calendar days from the date of approval of the contract by the appropriate government approving authority, the Procuring Entity shall issue the Notice to Proceed (NTP) together with a copy or copies of the approved contract to the successful Bidder. All notices called for by the terms of the contract shall be effective only at the time of receipt thereof by the successful Bidder.

35. Protest Mechanism

Decisions of the procuring entity at any stage of the procurement process may be questioned in accordance with Section 55 of the IRR of RA 9184.



WAGE ORDER NO. RBIII-22

SETTING THE MINIMUM WAGE RATES IN REGION III

WHEREAS, the Regional Tripartite Wages and Productivity Board – Region III, is mandated under Republic Act 6727 (The Wage Rationalization Act), to periodically assess wage rates and conduct continuing studies to determine and fix minimum wage rates in the region and issue corresponding Wage Orders, subject to the guidelines issued by the National Wages and Productivity Commission;

WHEREAS, pursuant to Sec. 3 (a) of NWPC Guidelines No. 01, Series of 2007, ("Amended Rules of Procedure on Minimum Wage Fixing") and NWPC Guidelines No. 01, Series of 2015 ("Guidelines in the Conduct of Public Consultations"), the Board "motu proprio" scheduled a series of provincial sectoral wage consultations to determine if there is a need to issue a new wage order, considering the socioeconomic indicators in the region and its provinces;

WHEREAS, the Board conducted public consultations in the following provinces: Bulacan and Pampanga (August 6, 2019); Bataan and Zambales (August 20, 2019); Tarlac and Nueva Ecija (September 10, 2019); and Aurora (September 11, 2019). A regional public hearing was held thereafter in the province of Pampanga on September 20, 2019;

WHEREAS, considering the result of the studies made on the prevailing socioeconomic conditions in the region and its provinces, the immediate call and appeal of all interested parties from both the workers' and employers' sector, and the results of the conduct of the provincial public consultations and regional public hearing, the Regional Board agreed to aid workers and their families to cope with the rising cost of living, help place every family in a decent and humane living condition, and at the same time promote the productivity of business enterprises as providers of employment opportunities;

WHEREAS, the Board deemed it just and equitable to increase the minimum wage, considering the amount needed to restore the purchasing power of the workers' wages, the need to share the fruits of the regional economic growth and development, and further intensify the promotion for installation of productivity-based incentive schemes under the Two-Tiered Wage System;

NOW THEREFORE, by virtue of the power and authority vested under Republic Act No. 6727, otherwise known as the Wage Rationalization Act, the Board hereby issues this Wage Order:

Section 1. AMOUNT OF INCREASE. Upon the effectivity of this Order, the basic pay of all private sector workers in the provinces of Aurora, Bataan, Bulacan, Nueva Ecija, Pampanga, Tarlac, and Zambales shall be adjusted by TWENTY PESOS (Php20.00) per day.

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The old and new minimum wage rates of covered workers in the private sector in Region III shall be as follows:

Section 2. COVERAGE. The new wage rates provided herein shall apply to all workers and employees receiving the minimum wage in the private sector in the region, regardless of their position, designation or status of employment and irrespective of the method by which their wages are paid.

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This Wage Order shall not cover household or domestic workers and persons employed in the personal service of another and workers of Barangay Micro Business Enterprises with Certificates of Authority, pursuant to R.A. 9178.

Section 3. BASIS OF INCREASE. The wage increase prescribed under this Wage Order shall be for the normal working hours, which shall not exceed eight (8) hours work a day.

Section 4. WORKERS PAID BY RESULTS. All workers paid by results, including those who are paid on piecework, "takay", "pakyaw", or task basis, shall be entitled to receive the prescribed increase in this order per eight (8) hours a day, or a proportion thereof for working less than eight (8) hours.

Section 5. SPECIAL GROUP OF WORKERS. The minimum wage rate of apprentices and learners shall in no case be less than seventy-five percent (75%) of the prescribed minimum wage rate under Section 1 of this Wage Order.

All recognized learnership and apprenticeship agreements entered into before the effectivity of this Order shall be considered automatically modified in accordance with the Wage Order.

All qualified handicapped workers shall receive the full amount of the new wage rates prescribed pursuant to R.A. 7277, otherwise known as the Magna Carta for Disabled Person.

Section 6. PRODUCTIVITY-BASED WAGES. In order to sustain rising levels of wages and enhance competitiveness, businesses are strongly encouraged to adopt productivity improvement schemes, such as, time and motion studies, good housekeeping, quality circles, labor-management cooperation, as well as implement gain-sharing programs. Accordingly, the Regional Board shall provide the necessary studies and technical assistance pursuant to RA 6971, the Productivity Incentives Act of 1990.

Section 7. PRIVATE EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS. In the case of private educational institutions, the share of workers and employees covered in the increase in tuition fees for School Year 2019-2020 shall be considered as compliance with this Wage Order. Where the share of the workers and employees is less than what is provided herein, the employer shall pay the difference starting School Year 2020-2021.

Private educational institutions which have not increased their tuition fees for the School Year 2019-2020 may defer compliance with the provisions of this Wage Order until School Year 2020-2021.

In any case, all private educational institutions shall implement the increase prescribed herein starting School Year 2020-2021.

Section 8. CONTRACTORS. In the case of contracts for construction projects and for security, janitorial and similar services, the prescribed wage increase of the workers shall be borne by the principals or clients of the construction/service contractors and their contracts shall be deemed amended accordingly. In the event, however, that the principals or clients fail to pay the prescribed increases, the construction/service contractors shall be jointly and severally liable with his principal or client.

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Section 9. EXEMPTION. Upon application with and as determined by the Board, the following may be exempt from the applicability of this Wage Order, subject to applicable rules and regulations issued by the Commission:

- Distressed Establishments, as defined in the NWPC Guidelines No. 02. Series of 2007;
- 2. Establishments adversely affected by calamities such as natural and/or human-induced disasters in accordance with NWPC Resolution No. 01, Series of 2014.

Section 10. APPEAL TO THE COMMISSION. Any party aggrieved by this Wage Order may file a verified appeal to the Commission through the Board within ten (10) calendar days from the publication of the Order.

Section 11. EFFECT OF FILING OF APPEAL. The filing of the appeal does not operate to stay the Order unless the party appealing such Order shall file with the Commission an undertaking with a surety or sureties satisfactory to the Commission for payment of the corresponding increase to employees affected by the Order in the event such Order is affirmed.

Section 12. CREDITING. Increases granted by an employer within ninety (90) days prior to the effectivity of this Wage Order shall be credited as compliance with the Order, provided that, where such increases are less than what is provided in the Order, the employer shall pay the difference.

Such increases shall not include CBA anniversary wage increases, merit wage increases and those resulting from the regularization or promotion of employee, unless there is an agreement expressly allowing such crediting.

Section 13. EFFECTS ON EXISTING WAGE STRUCTURE. Pursuant to Article 124 of the Labor Code of the Philippines, as amended, any dispute that should arise as a result of a significant wage distortion, the employer and the union shall negotiate to correct the distortion through the grievance procedure under their Collective Bargaining Agreement, and if it remains unresolved, through voluntary arbitration. Unless otherwise agreed by the parties in writing, such dispute shall be decided by the voluntary arbitrator or panel of voluntary arbitrators within ten (10) calendar days from the time said dispute was referred to voluntary arbitration.

In cases where there are no collective bargaining agreements or recognized labor unions, the employers and workers shall endeavor to correct such distortions. Any dispute arising therefrom shall be settled through the National Conciliation and Mediation Board (NCMB) and if it remains unresolved after ten (10) calendar days of conciliation, the same shall be referred to the appropriate branch of the National Labor Relations Commission (NLRC). The NLRC shall conduct continuous hearings and decide the dispute within twenty (20) calendar days from the time said dispute is submitted for compulsory arbitration.

Section 14. COMPLAINTS FOR NON-COMPLIANCE. Complaints for noncompliance with this Wage Order shall be filed with the Regional Office of the Department of Labor and Employment (DOLE) having jurisdiction over the workplace and shall be subject to the mandatory thirty (30) days conciliation and mediation process under Single Entry Approach (SEnA). However, if settlement fails, the case becomes subject of enforcement proceedings under Article 128 and 129 of the Labor Code, as amended.

- Section 15. NON-DIMINUTION OF BENEFITS. Nothing in this Wage Order shall be construed to reduce any existing wage rates, allowances, and benefits of any form under existing laws, decrees, issuance, executive orders and/or under any contract or agreement between workers and employers.
- Section 16. PENAL PROVISION. Any person, corporation, trust or firm, partnership, association or entity which refuses or fails to pay the prescribed wage rates in accordance with this Wage Order shall be subject to the penal provisions under R.A. 6727, as amended by R.A. 8188.
- Section 17. PROHIBITION AGAINST INJUNCTION. No preliminary or permanent injunction or temporary restraining order may be issued by any court. tribunal, or other entity against any proceedings before the Board.
- Section 18. FREEDOM TO BARGAIN. This Wage Order shall not be construed to prevent workers in particular firms or enterprises of industries from bargaining for higher wages with their respective employers.
- Section 19. REPORTING REQUIREMENTS. Any person, company, corporation, partnership, or any entities engaged in business shall submit a verified itemized listing of their labor component to the Board not later than January 31, 2019 and every year thereafter in accordance with the form prescribed by the Commission.
- Section 20. REPEALING CLAUSE. All orders, rules, and regulations, or parts thereof inconsistent with the provision of this Wage Order are hereby repealed, amended or modified accordingly.
- Section 21. SEPARABILITY CLAUSE. If, for any reason, any section or provision of this Wage Order is declared unconstitutional or illegal, the other provisions or parts shall remain valid.
- Section 22. IMPLEMENTING RULES. The Board shall prepare the necessary rules to implement this Wage Order subject to the approval of the Secretary of Labor and Employment.
- Section 23. ADVISORY ON PERFORMANCE BASED INCENTIVE PAY. Pursuant to the Two-Tiered Wage System, Advisory No. RTWPBIII-01 has been issued to guide establishments in the formulation, adoption and implementation of productivity programs and performance and productivity-based incentive schemes that an enterprise may provide based on agreement between workers and management.

Section 24. EFFECTIVITY. This Wage Order shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its publication in at least one (1) newspaper of general circulation.

WAGE ORDER NO. RB1-20

"PROVIDING FOR NEW DAILY MINIMUM WAGE RATES OF WORKERS AND EMPLOYEES IN REGION 1."

WHEREAS, the Regional Tripartite Wages and Productivity Board No. 1 (RTWPB-1) is mandated under R.A. 6727 (The Wage Rationalization Act) to periodically review the prevailing socio-economic and other conditions in the Region and if necessary to determine the applicable daily minimum wage rates;

WHEREAS, the previous Wage Order No. RB1-19 issued by the Board on November 24, 2017 which took effect on 25 January 2018 had already reached its one (1) year anniversary on 25 January 2019;

WHEREAS, in the absence of any petition for wage increase, the Board, *motu proprio*, reviewed the existing wage rates, and after due notice to concerned labor and management sectors, conducted public hearings on 15 February 2019 in Dagupan City, Pangasinan for the provinces of La Union and Pangasinan and 19 February 2019 in Vigan City for the provinces of Ilocos Sur and Ilocos Norte with concerned labor and management sectors in order to determine whether there is a need to adjust the minimum wages in the Region;

WHEREAS, after giving due consideration on the results of the public hearings and consistent with the government policy of inclusive growth, the Board deemed it necessary to adjust the prevailing daily wage rates of workers/employees in the Region to enable them to cope with the rising cost of living without impairing the viability of business and industry;

WHEREAS, there is a need to simplify the wage structure and adopt employment size in determining the classification of the various industries for easier administration and implementation of the wage order as well as to conform with the provisions of RA 6727, Sec. 4(a), which provides, among others, employment size as basis

NOW THEREFORE, by virtue of the power and authority vested under Republic Act No. 6727, otherwise known as the Wage Rationalization Act, the Regional Tripartite Wages and Productivity Board – Region 1 hereby issues this Order.

SECTION 1. NEW MINIMUM WAGE RATES

Upon the effectivity of this Order, the Minimum Wage Rates of all workers/employees in the private sector in the Region shall be increased as follows:

- a. For workers receiving P310/day in establishments employing 30 or more, shall receive an increase of P30/day.
- b. For workers receiving P285/day in establishments employing 10 to 29 workers, shall receive an increase of P25/day.

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- c. For workers receiving P265/day in establishments employing less than 10 workers, shall receive an increase of P17/day.
- d. For workers receiving P256/day in establishments employing less than 10 workers, shall receive an increase of P17/day upon effectivity of this Order and additional P9/day 6 months after effectivity of this Order.
- e. For workers receiving P265/day in Agriculture Plantation enterprises, shall receive an increase of THIRTY PESOS (P30.00)/day.
- f. For workers receiving P256/day in Agriculture Non-Plantation enterprises, shall receive an increase of TWENTY SIX PESOS (P26.00)/day.

The new daily minimum wage rates of covered workers in the private sector in Region 1 shall be as follows:

SECTION 2. COVERAGE:


All workers/employees in the private sector receiving the minimum wage rates in the Region are covered by the wage increase prescribed herein irrespective of their positions, designations or status of employment and regardless of the method by which their wages are paid.

This Order shall not cover Kasambahay/Domestic workers; persons employed in the personal service of another; and workers and employees of registered Barangay Micro Business Enterprises (BMBE) with Certificates of Authority pursuant to Republic Act 9178, as amended.

SECTION 3. BASIS OF MINIMUM WAGE

The minimum wage rates prescribed under this Order shall be for the normal working hours which shall not exceed eight (8) hours work per day.









SECTION 4. PRODUCTIVITY AND OTHER PERFORMANCE INCENTIVE PROGRAM (PIP)

In order to sustain increasing levels of wages and enhance competitiveness, labor and management as partners are encouraged to adopt productivity improvement schemes that will improve the quality of life of workers and in turn enable them to produce and earn more, such as time and motion studies, good housekeeping, quality circles, labor and management cooperation as well as implement gain-sharing and other performance incentive programs.

Pursuant to the Two-Tiered Wage System, Wage Advisory No. RB 1-01 has been issued to guide private establishments in the formulation, adoption and implementation of productivity programs and performance and productivity-based incentive that an enterprise may provide based on agreement between workers and management.

The Board shall continue to issue advisories on PIPs for adoption by all sectors in the Region.

SECTION 5. MINIMUM WAGE RATES APPLICABLE TO BUSINESS ESTABLISHMENTS WITH **MULTIPLE BUSINESS ACTIVITIES**

The minimum wage rates applicable to business establishments performing multiple business activities not separately registered with any appropriate government agency shall be determined in accordance with their dominant business activity.

SECTION 6. CREDITABLE WAGE INCREASE

Wage increases granted by an employer within three (3) months prior to the effectivity of this Wage Order by virtue of Collective Bargaining Agreement in unionized establishments and those of the non-unionized sectors setting equal or greater than the minimum wage rates herein provided shall be considered compliance herewith; and


Anniversary wage increases, merit wage increases and those resulting from their regularizations or promotion of employees shall not be credited as compliance.


SECTION 7. WORKERS PAID BY RESULTS

All workers paid by results, including those who are paid on piecework, "takay", "pakyaw" or task basis, shall receive not less than the adjusted amount prescribed by this Order for the normal working hours which shall not exceed eight (8) hours per day or a proportion thereof for working less than eight (8) hours.

SECTION 8. WAGES OF SPECIAL GROUPS OF WORKERS AND EMPLOYEES

Persons employed under Apprenticeship or Learnership Agreement shall be entitled to not less than Seventy Five Percent (75%) of the new minimum wage rates under this Order.







All Learnership and Apprenticeship Agreements entered into before the effectivity of this Order shall be automatically modified insofar as their wage clauses are concerned to reflect the new prescribed wage rates.

All qualified handicapped workers shall receive the full amount of increase in this Order pursuant to R.A. 7277.

SECTION 9. APPLICATION TO PRIVATE EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS

All Private Educational Institutions shall implement this Order starting School Year 2018-2019.

The share in the tuition fee increases of covered workers and employees for School Year 2018-2019 shall be considered as compliance with this Order, however, payment of any shortfall shall be given starting School Year 2019-2020.

Private Educational Institutions which have not increased their tuition fees for the School Year 2018-2019, may defer compliance with the provisions of this Order until School Year 2019-2020.

SECTION 10. APPLICATION TO CONTRACTORS

In the case of contracts for construction projects and for security, janitorial and similar services, the prescribed increase shall be borne by the principals or clients of the construction/service contractors and the contracts shall be deemed amended accordingly. In the event, however, that the principals or clients fail to pay the prescribed increase, the construction/service contractors shall be jointly and severally liable with their principals or clients.

SECION 11. MOBILE AND BRANCH WORKERS/EMPLOYEES

The minimum wage rates of workers and employees, who by the nature of their work have to travel, shall be those applicable in the domicile or head office of the employer.

The minimum wage rates of workers and employees working in branches or agencies of establishments within or outside the region shall be those applicable in the place where they are stationed.

SECTION 12. TRANSFER OF WORKERS AND EMPLOYEES

The transfer of workers and employees from one region to another shall not diminish the wage rates being enjoyed by them prior to such transfer. The workers and employees transferred to other regions with higher wage rates shall be entitled to the minimum wage rate applicable therein.

SECTION 13. EXEMPTION

The following categories of establishments may be exempted from compliance with this Order, upon application with and as determined by the Board in accordance with the National Wages and Productivity Commission (NWPC) Guidelines No. 2, Series of 2007 (NWPC Amended Rules on Exemption)

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- 1. Distressed establishments;
- 2. New business establishments;
- 3. Retail/Service establishments employing not more than ten (10)
- 4. Establishments adversely affected by calamities such as natural and human-induced disasters.

SECTION 14. DURATION AND EXTENT OF EXEMPTION

Establishments that applied for exemption and found qualified may be granted a partial or full exemption of one (1) year in accordance with the NWPC Guidelines No. 02, Series of 2007.

SECTION 15. EFFECT OF APPLICATION FOR EXEMPTION

An application for exemption duly filed shall have the effect of deferring any action on any complaint for non-compliance with the Order until resolution of the application by the Board.

In case the application for exemption is not approved, covered workers and employees of the applicant-establishment shall be paid the prescribed minimum wage rates under this Order plus one percent (1%) simple interest per month retroactive to the effectivity of this Order.

SECTION 16. APPEAL TO THE COMMISSION

Any party aggrieved by this Order may file a verified appeal with the NWPC through the Board within ten (10) calendar days from the publication of this Order.

SECTION 17. EFFECT OF AN APPEAL


The filing of the appeal does not operate to stay this Order unless the party appealing such Order shall file with the NWPC an undertaking with a surety or sureties satisfactory to the NWPC for payment of the corresponding increase for covered workers and employees in the event this Order is affirmed.

SECTION 18. EFFECT ON EXISTING WAGE STRUCTURE

In case the wage increases provided for by this Order result in the distortion of the wage structure within an establishment, the same shall be corrected in accordance with the procedure provided for under Article 124 of the Labor Code, as amended.

SECTION 19. COMPLAINTS FOR NON-COMPLIANCE

Complaints for non-compliance with this Order shall be filed with the Department of Labor and Employment Regional Office I (DOLE-Region 1) having jurisdiction over the workplace and shall be subject to the mandatory thirty (30) day conciliation and mediation process under Single Entry Approach (SEnA). However, if settlement fails, the case becomes subject of enforcement proceedings under Article 128 of the Labor Code, as amended.







SECTION 20. NON-DIMINUTION OF BENEFITS

Nothing in this Order shall be construed to reduce any existing wage rates, allowances and benefits of any form under existing laws, decrees, issuances, executive orders and/or under any contract or agreement between the workers/employees and employers.

SECTION 21. PENAL PROVISION

Any person, corporation, trust or firm, partnership, association or entity who refuses or fails to pay the prescribed increases in this Order, shall be punished by a fine of not less than P25,000.00 nor more than P100,000.00 or imprisonment of not less than two (2) years nor more than four (4) years or both such fine and imprisonment at the discretion of the court pursuant to the provision of Section 12 of R.A 6727, as amended by R.A. 8188.

SECTION 22. PROHIBITION AGAINST INJUNCTION

No preliminary or permanent injunction or temporary restraining order may be issued by any court, tribunal or other entity against any proceedings before the Board.

SECTION 23. FREEDOM TO BARGAIN

This Order shall not be construed to prevent workers in particular firms or enterprises or industries from bargaining for higher wages with their respective employers.

SECTION 24. REPORTORIAL REQUIREMENT

Any person, company, corporation, partnership or any entity engaged in the business shall submit a verified itemized listing of their labor component to the Board not later than 31 January 2019 and every year thereafter in accordance with the form prescribed by the NWPC.

SECTION 25. REPEALING CLAUSE

All orders, issuances, rules and regulations, or parts thereof inconsistent with the provision of this Order are hereby repealed, amended or modified accordingly.

SECTION 26. IMPLEMENTING RULES

The Board shall prepare the necessary rules to implement this Order subject to the approval of the Secretary of Labor and Employment.


SECTION 27. SEPARABILITY CLAUSE

If, for any reason, any section or provision of this Order is declared unconstitutional or illegal, the other provisions or parts shall remain valid.

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SECTION 28. EFFECTIVITY

This Order shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its publication in a newspaper of general circulation in the Region.





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

Corporate Information

Dark Horse Security Agency Inc. (The Company) is engage in the operation of security agency. I Company was registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission on October 25, 2013 under S.

The registered office of the Company which is also its principal place of business is located at Room 3 Sir Williams Hotel, Timog Avenuc, South Triangle, Quezon City. The Company adopted a calendar ye accounting period. The Company was registered as VAT Taxpayer with the Bureau of Internal Rever (BIR) on February 28, 2015 and was assigned Taxpayer Identification No. 007-828-232-000, at Rever.

The financial statements of the Company for the year ended December 31, 2019 were approved by t Board of Directors and authorized for issue on March 9, 2020. The board of directors is still empower to make revisions on the financial Statements even after the date of issue.

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Preparation and Statement of Compliance (a)

The financial statements of the Company have been prepared in compliance with Philippin Financial Reporting Standard for Small Entities (PFRS for Small Entities) issued by the Financial Reporting Standards Council and adopted by the Securities & Exchange Commission (SEC).

The PFRS for Small Entities was approved for adoption by Philippine Financial Reporting Council on December 13, 2017 and by the Securities & Exchange Commission (SEC) c March 22, 2018 under SEC Memorandum Circular No. 5 (Series of 2018). The PFRS for Small Entitie effective for annual periods beginning on or after January 1, 2019. Earlier adoption is permitted

The PFRS for Small Entities reduced options for accounting treatment, climinated topics that are no generally relevant to small entities, simplified methods for recognition and measurement, and reduce

Small entities are those that meet all of the following criteria:

- a) Total assets of between P3.0 million to P100.0 million or total liabilities of P3.0 million to P100.0 million. If the entity is a parent company, the said amounts shall be based on the consolidated
- b) Are not required to file financial statements under Part II of SRC Rule 68;
- c) Are not in the process of filing their financial starements for the purpose of issuing ny class of
- d) Are not holder of secondary licenses issued by regulatory agencies.

The company meets all of the above criteria and adopts the Philippine Financial Reporting Standard for Small Entities (PFRS for Small Entities) starting annual period ending January 31, 2019.

There is no transition adjustments on the company's shift from PFRS for SME to PFRS for Small Entities.

durement Bases

The financial statements are presented in Philippine Peso, the Company's functional currency. All values are in absolute amounts, except when otherwise stated.

The financial statements have been prepared on a historical cost basis. Historical cost is generally based on the fair value of the consideration given in exchange for an asset. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the transaction date.

(c) Basic Financial Instruments

The Company recognizes a financial asset and a financial liability only when the Company becomes party to the contractual provisions of a financial instrument.

When a financial asset or financial liability is recognized initially, the Company measures it at the transaction price and subsequently measures at its amortized cost using the effective interest method, except for financial assets measured at fair value which are subsequently measured at fair value.

- 1. Cash in Banks. Cash in banks is stated at face amount, earns interest at the prevailing bank deposit rate and is immediately available for use in the current operations.
- Trade and Other Receivables. Trade and other receivables are recognized initially at transaction price. These are subsequently measured at the undiscounted amount of the cash or other consideration expected to be received, less any provision for impairment. Provision for impairment on trade and other receivables is recognized in statement of income, when there is objective evidence that the amount of trade and
- 3. Refundable Deposits. Refundable deposits pertain to payments to lessor on lease agreements entered by the Company. These are initially measured at fair value and subsequently measured at the undiscounted amount of cash or other consideration expected to be received at the end of the term.
- 4. Trade and Other Payables. Trade and other payables are obligations of the Company that are incurred during its normal operating cycle and are noninterest-bearing. These are recognized initially at the transaction price and subsequently measured at the undiscounted amount of cash or consideration
- 5. Loans Payable are recognized initially at the transaction price, that is, the present value of cash the bank, including transaction cost. Borrowings are subsequently stated as amortized cost. Interest expense is recognized on the basis of the effective interest finance cost. Borrowings are classified as current liabilities method and is included in unless the company has an unconditional right to defer settlement of the liability for at least 12 months after the reporting date.

(d) Other Current Assets

Includes prepaid income tax, current portion of deferred input value added tax and current input VAT for remittance to the tax agency.

- 1. Prepaid Income Tax consist of creditable withholding tax (CWT) and overpayments of income tax. CWT pertains to tax withheld and remitted to the Bureau of Internal Revenue (BIR) by the customers or clients of the company and is deducted from income tax payable on the same year the revenue was recognized. Prepaid income taxes are carried forward to be utilized in succeeding years.
- Deferred Input VAT pertains to the input VAT on purchases of capital goods with an aggregate acquisition cost in each of the calendar month exceeding 1,000,000 that are claimed as credit against output VAT over 60 months or the estimated useful lives of capital goods, whichever is shorter.

hy and Equipment

Property and equipment are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation, amortization, and any impairment in value.

The initial cost of property and equipment comprises its purchase price (after deducting trade discounts and rebates), including import duties and purchase taxes, and any directly attributable costs of bringing the asset to its working condition and location for its intended use.

Expenditures incurred after the property and equipment have been put into operation, such as repairs, maintenance, and overhaul costs, are normally recognized in profit or loss in the year the costs are incurred. In situations where it can be clearly demonstrated that the expenditures have resulted in an increase in the future economic benefits expected to be obtained from the use of an item of property and equipment beyond its originally assessed standard of performance, the expenditures are capitalized as additional costs of property and equipment. The cost of replacing a component of an item of property and equipment is recognized if it is probable that the future economic benefits embodied within the component will flow to the Company, and its cost can be measured reliably. The carrying amount of the replaced component is derecognized.

When significant parts of an item of property and equipment have different useful lives, these are accounted for as separate items (major components) of property and equipment.

Depreciation and amortization are calculated on a straight-line basis over the following estimated useful lives of the property and equipment:

The estimated useful lives and depreciation and amortization method are reviewed at each reporting date to ensure that these are consistent with the expected pattern of economic benefits from items of property and equipment.

When assets are retired or otherwise disposed of, the cost and the related accumulated depreciation, amortization and any impairment in value are removed from the accounts.

Any resulting gain or loss is recognized in profit or loss.

(f) Impairment of Non-Financial Assets

The carrying amounts of the Company's nonfinancial assets are reviewed at each reporting date to determine if there is any indication of impairment. If any such indication exists, the asset's recoverable amount is estimated.

The recoverable amount of an asset is the greater of its value in use and fair value less costs to sell. Value in use is the present value of future cash flows expected to be derived from an asset while fair value less cost to sell is the amount obtainable from the sale of an asset in an arm's length transaction between knowledgeable and willing parties less costs of disposal. In assessing value in use, the estimated future cash flows are discounted to their present values using a pre-tax discount rate that reflects current market assessments of the time value of money and the risks

to the asset. Any impairment loss is recognized in profit or loss if the carrying amount exceeds ecoverable amount.

Impairment losses recognized in prior periods are assessed at each reporting date for any indications that the loss has decreased or no longer exists. An impairment loss is reversed if there has been a change in the estimates used to determine the recoverable amount.

An impairment loss is reversed only to the extent that the asset's carrying amount does not exceed the carrying amount that would have been determined (net of depreciation and amortization) had no impairment loss been recognized.

(g) Equity

Capital Stock. Capital stock is measured at par value for all shares issued and subscribed.

Retained Earnings. Retained earnings represent the cumulative balance of net income or loss, net of any dividend declaration. Unappropriated retained earnings pertain to the unrestricted portion available for dividend declaration, net of stock issuance costs. Appropriated retained earnings pertain to the restricted portion which is intended for expansion projects.

Dividend Distribution. Dividend distribution to the stockholders is recognized as a liability and deducted from equity in the year in which the dividends are approved for declaration by the BOD.

(h) Revenue Recognition

Revenue is recognized to the extent that it is probable that the economic benefits will flow to the Company and the amount of revenue can be measured reliably. Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable, taking into account contractually defined terms of payment and excluding taxes or duties.

The Company is acting as a principal in all of its revenue arrangements.

The Company recognizes its revenues as follows:

Sales revenue is recognized upon the full rendition and acceptance of the services by the customer.

Interest Income. Interest income is recognized in profit or loss based on the prevailing bank deposit rates as it accrues, net of final tax.

(i) Cost and Expense Recognition

Costs and expenses are recognized in profit or loss when a decrease in future economic benefit related to a decrease in an asset or an increase of a liability has arisen that can be measured reliably.

- 1. Cost of Services Sold is recognized as expense when the related services are rendered to and accepted by customers.
- 2. Operating Expenses. Operating expenses constitute costs of administering the business and costs incurred to sell and market the goods. These are recognized in profit or loss as incurred.

(j) Operating Lease

Leases which do not transfer to the Company substantially all the risks and rewards of ownership of the asset are classified as operating lease. Operating lease payments are recognized as an expense in profit or loss on a straight-line basis, unless payments are structured to increase in line with expected general inflation or another systematic basis which is a better representative of the time pattern of the user's benefit.

Laxes

- 1. Current Income Tax. Current tax assets and liabilities are measured at the amount expected to be recovered from or paid to the tax authority. The tax rates and tax laws used to compute the amount are those that have been enacted or substantively enacted at the reporting date.
- 2. Deferred Income Tax. Deferred tax is provided on all temporary differences at the reporting date between the tax bases of assets and liabilities and their carrying amounts for financial reporting purposes.

Deferred tax liabilities are recognized for all taxable temporary differences. Deferred tax assets are recognized for all deductible temporary differences to the extent that it is probable that sufficient future taxable profits will be available against which the deductible temporary differences can be utilized. Deferred tax, however, is not recognized when it arises from the initial recognition of an asset or liability in a transaction that is not a business combination and, at the time of the transaction, affects neither the accounting profit not taxable profit or loss.

The carrying amount of deferred tax assets is reviewed at each reporting date and reduced to the extent that it is no longer probable that sufficient taxable profit will be available to allow all or part of the deferred tax asset to be utilized. Unrecognized deferred tax assets are reassessed at each reporting date and are recognized to the extent that it has become probable that future taxable profit will allow the deferred tax assets to be recovered.

Deferred tax assets and liabilities are measured at the tax rates that are expected to apply to the period when the asset is realized or the liability is settled, based on tax rates and tax laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted at the reporting date.

Deferred tax assets and liabilities are offset, if a legally enforceable right exists to set off current tax assets against current tax liabilities and the deferred taxes relate to the same taxable entity and the same taxation authority.

- 3. <u>Input Value-Added Tax (VAT)</u>. Revenue, expenses, and assets are generally recognized net of the amount of VAT. The net amount of VAT payable to the taxation authority is included as part of "Trade and other payables" account in the statement of financial position.
- 4. <u>Deferred Input VAT</u>. Deferred input VAT pertains to the input VAT on purchases of capital goods with an aggregate acquisition cost in each of the calendar month exceeding 1,000,000 that are claimed as credit against output VAT over 60 months or the estimated useful lives of capital goods, whichever is shorter.
- 5. <u>Deferred Output VAT</u>. Output VAT pertains to the output VAT on uncollected sales receivables. As a Service Company, the company recognizes and remitted VAT at the time of the collection of the trade receivables and not at the time of billing the services rendered. Output tax on trade receivables are deferred until the same are collected. Upon collection of trade receivables, the company issues the related Official Receipts and the related deferred output tax is subsequently reversed.

(l) Related Party Transactions

Parties are considered to be related if one party has the ability, directly or indirectly, to control the other party or exercise significant influence over the other party in making financial and operating decisions. Parties are also considered to be related if they are subject to common control. Related parties maybe or corporate entities. Transactions between related parties are accounted for at arm's length prices or on terms similar to those offered to non-related parties in an economically comparable market.

rovisions

Provisions are recognized when the Company has a present obligation (legal or constructive) as a result of a past event, it is probable that an outflow of resources embodying economic benefits will be required to settle the obligation, and a reliable estimate can be made of the amount of the obligation. If the effect of the time value of money is material, provisions are discounted using a current pre-tax rate that reflects current market assessment of the time value of money and, where appropriate, the risks specific to the liability. Where discounting is used, the increase in the provision due to the passage of time is recognized as an interest expense.

(n) Contingencies

Contingencies are not recognized in the financial statements. These are disclosed unless the possibility of an outflow of resources embodying economic benefits is remote. Contingent assets are not recognized in the financial statements but are disclosed in the notes to financial statements when an inflow of economic benefits is probable.

(o) Events After the Financial Reporting Year

Events after the reporting year that provide additional information about the Company's financial position at reporting date (adjusting events) are reflected in the financial statements. Events after the reporting year that are not adjusting events are disclosed in the notes to the financial statements when material.

3. Significant Judgment, Accounting Estimates, and Assumptions

The judgment, estimates, and assumptions used in the financial statements are based upon management's evaluation of relevant facts and circumstances as at the reporting date of the financial statements. While the Company believes that the assumptions are reasonable and appropriate, significant differences in the actual experience or significant changes in the assumptions may materially affect the estimated amounts. Actual results could differ from such estimates. The judgment, estimates, and underlying assumptions are reviewed on an on-going basis. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognized in the period in which the estimate is revised and in any future periods affected.

(a) Judgment

1. Determining the Classification of Lease Commitment. The Company, as a lessee, has operating lease agreements for its office space and branch sites. The Company has determined that the risks and rewards of ownership related to the leased properties are retained by the lessor. Accordingly, the leases are accounted for as operating leases.

(b) Estimates and Assumptions

1. Assessing Impairment of Trade and Other Receivables. The Company reviews its trade and other receivables at each reporting date to assess whether objective evidence of impairment exists and to measure the amount of impairment loss that is required to be recognized in profit or loss. Management uses historical loss experience for assets with similar credit risk characteristics when estimating future cash flows and probable losses both on an individual credit basis and for the portfolio as a whole. The methodology and assumptions used for estimating both the amount and timing of future cash flows are reviewed regularly to reduce any differences between loss estimates and actual loss experience.

Impairment of Inventories. The Company determines if the estimated selling price less costs to implete and sell the inventories becomes lower than its cost due to damage, physical deterioration, obsolescence, changes in price levels, or other causes.

3. Estimating Useful Lives of Property and Equipment. The Company estimates the useful lives of property and equipment based on the period over which the assets are expected to be available for use and are updated if expectations differ from previous estimates due to physical wear and tear, technical and commercial obsolescence. The estimated useful lives and depreciation methods are reviewed periodically to ensure that these are consistent with the expected pattern of economic benefits from individual items of property and equipment.

There were no changes in the estimated useful lives of the Company's property and equipment during the subject year and the immediate preceding year.

4. Assessing Impairment of Nonfinancial Assets. Assessing nonfinancial assets for impairment includes considering certain indicators of impairment such as significant changes in asset usage, significant decline in market value, obsolescence, or physical damage of an asset. If such indicators are present and where the carrying amount of the asset exceeds its recoverable amount, the asset is considered impaired and is written down to its recoverable amount.

No impairment loss on nonfinancial assets was recognized by the Company during the current year and the immediate earlier year.

5. Retirement Benefit Expense. The Company accrues minimum retirement benefit liability in accordance with Republic Act (R.A.) No. 7641, 'Retirement Pay Law," which requires a company to pay minimum retirement benefits to employees who retire after reaching the mandatory retirement age of 65 years old or the optional retirement age of 60 years old with at least five (5) years of service to the Company.

Due to undue cost or effort to use the projected unit credit method to measure its obligation and cost under the defined benefit plans, the Company ignores the following:

- estimated future salary increases (i.e., assume current salaries continue until current employees are expected to begin receiving post-employment benefits);
- future service of current employees (i.e., assume closure of the plan for existing as well as any new employees); and
- possible in-service mortality of current employees between the reporting date and the date employees are expected to begin receiving post-employment benefits (i.e., assume all current employees will receive the post-employment benefits).

Retirement benefit costs, which consist of current service cost and past service cost on the defined benefit obligation, are recognized in the statements of comprehensive income in the period in which they arise.

6. Assessing Realizability of Deferred Tax Assets. The Company reviews the carrying amounts of deferred tax assets at each reporting date and reduces the balance to the extent that it is no longer probable that sufficient taxable profits will be available to allow all or part of the deferred tax assets to be utilized.

I. INTRODUCTION

A. Authorization

In compliance with the bidding requirements, we are submitting the general security plan for DICT Luzon Cluster 1 (La Union and Pangasinan) and DICT Luzon Cluster 2 (Aurora and Nucva Ecija).

II. NAME AND MISSION OF INSTALLATION

The Department of Information and Communication Technology (DICT) shall be the primary policy, planning, coordinating, implementing and administrative entity of the Executive Branch of the government that will plan, develop and promote the national ICT development agenda (RA10844).

III. ASSESSMENT

Most of the installations are located strategically in the provinces of La Union, Pangasinan, Aurora, and Nueva Ecija. It was identified that these installations are located in an industrial and residential zone.

A comprehensive security plan will be submitted after a security survey is conducted in all areas mentioned above.

We will provide the number of security personnel that will be required in each installation equipped with long firearm such as a 12-gauge shotgun, communications equipment such as cellular phone and 2-way radio and CCTV camera, if needed. Alarm system will be installed and to be utilized in case of emergencies. A sensor lighting system will also be installed.

IV. PHYSICAL SECURITY

A. Barriers

We will conduct assessment on the present condition in the perimeter fence.

We will submit the proper recommendation based on the security standards to ensure the highest level of safety and security on each installation after a security survey was conducted.

B. Lighting Fixtures

Lighting fixtures inside and outside the building/s should be adequate enough.

Lighting fixtures must be maintained and checked periodically to ensure proper illumination of the area.

C. Personnel Access and Control

Visitors, deliveries and the like will be verified first with their contact person before given access into the premises. The same will be required to fill up in the visitor's logbook / log sheet and ask him/her to leave a valid ID with the guard on duty before entering the premises.





Corporate Information

Dark Horse Security Agency Inc. (The Company) is engage in the operation of security agency. The Company was registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission on October 25, 2013 under SE Registration No. CS201420797.

The registered office of the Company which is also its principal place of business is located at Room 31! Sir Williams Hotel, Timog Avenuc, South Triangle, Quezon City. The Company adopted a calendar year accounting period. The Company was registered as VAT Taxpayer with the Bureau of Internal Revenu (BIR) on February 28, 2015 and was assigned Taxpayer Identification No. 007-828-232-000, at Revenu District Office 040.

The financial statements of the Company for the year ended December 31, 2019 were approved by th Board of Directors and authorized for issue on March 9, 2020. The board of directors is still empowere to make revisions on the financial Statements even after the date of issue.

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

(a) Basis of Preparation and Statement of Compliance

The financial statements of the Company have been prepared in compliance with Philippin Financial Reporting Standard for Small Entities (PFRS for Small Entities) issued by the Financia Reporting Standards Council and adopted by the Securities & Exchange Commission (SEC).

The PFRS for Small Entities was approved for adoption by Philippine Financial Reporting Standards Council on December 13, 2017 and by the Securities & Exchange Commission (SEC) of March 22, 2018 under SEC Memorandum Circular No. 5 (Series of 2018). The PFRS for Small Entitie effective for annual periods beginning on or after January 1, 2019. Earlier adoption is permitted.

The PFRS for Small Entities reduced options for accounting treatment, climinated topics that are no generally relevant to small entities, simplified methods for recognition and measurement, and reduced disclosure requirement.

Small entities are those that meet all of the following criteria:

- a) Total assets of between P3.0 million to P100.0 million or total liabilities of P3.0 million to P100.0 million. If the entity is a parent company, the said amounts shall be based on the consolidated figures;
- b) Are not required to file financial statements under Part II of SRC Rule 68;
- c) Are not in the process of filing their financial starements for the purpose of issuing ny class of instruments in public market;
- d) Are not holder of secondary licenses issued by regulatory agencies.

The company meets all of the above criteria and adopts the Philippine Financial Reporting Standard for Small Entities (PFRS for Small Entities) starting annual period ending January 31, 2019.

There is no transition adjustments on the company's shift from PFRS for SME to PFRS for Small Entities.

durement Bases

The financial statements are presented in Philippine Peso, the Company's functional currency. All values are in absolute amounts, except when otherwise stated.

The financial statements have been prepared on a historical cost basis. Historical cost is generally based on the fair value of the consideration given in exchange for an asset. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the transaction date.

(c) Basic Financial Instruments

The Company recognizes a financial asset and a financial liability only when the Company becomes a party to the contractual provisions of a financial instrument.

When a financial asset or financial liability is recognized initially, the Company measures it at the transaction price and subsequently measures at its amortized cost using the effective interest method, except for financial assets measured at fair value which are subsequently measured at fair value.

- 1. Cash in Banks. Cash in banks is stated at face amount, earns interest at the prevailing bank deposit rate and is immediately available for use in the current operations.
- 2. Trade and Other Receivables. Trade and other receivables are recognized initially at transaction price. These are subsequently measured at the undiscounted amount of the cash or other consideration expected to be received, less any provision for impairment. Provision for impairment on trade and other receivables is recognized in statement of income, when there is objective evidence that the amount of trade and
- 3. Refundable Deposits. Refundable deposits pertain to payments to lessor on lease agreements entered by the Company. These are initially measured at fair value and subsequently measured at the undiscounted amount of cash or other consideration expected to be received at the end of the term.
- Trade and Other Payables. Trade and other payables are obligations of the Company that are incurred during its normal operating cycle and are noninterest-bearing. These are recognized initially at the transaction price and subsequently measured at the undiscounted amount of cash or consideration
- 5. Loans Payable are recognized initially at the transaction price, that is, the present value of cash the bank, including transaction cost. Borrowings are subsequently stated as amortized cost. Interest expense is recognized on the basis of the effective interest finance cost. Borrowings are classified as current liabilities method and is included in right to defer settlement of the liability for at unless the company has an unconditional least 12 months after the reporting date.

(d) Other Current Assets

Includes prepaid income tax, current portion of deferred input value added tax and current input VAT for remittance to the tax agency.

- 1. Prepaid Income Tax consist of creditable withholding tax (CWT) and overpayments of income tax. CWT pertains to tax withheld and remitted to the Bureau of Internal Revenue (BIR) by the customers or clients of the company and is deducted from income tax payable on the same year the revenue was recognized. Prepaid income taxes are carried forward to be utilized in succeeding years.
- Deferred Input VAT pertains to the input VAT on purchases of capital goods with an aggregate acquisition cost in each of the calendar month exceeding 1,000,000 that are claimed as credit against output VAT over 60 months or the estimated useful lives of capital goods, whichever is shorter.

ky and Equipment

Property and equipment are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation, amortization, and any impairment in value.

The initial cost of property and equipment comprises its purchase price (after deducting trade discounts and rebates), including import duties and purchase taxes, and any directly attributable costs of bringing the asset to its working condition and location for its intended use.

Expenditures incurred after the property and equipment have been put into operation, such as repairs, maintenance, and overhaul costs, are normally recognized in profit or loss in the year the costs are incurred. In situations where it can be clearly demonstrated that the expenditures have resulted in an increase in the future economic benefits expected to be obtained from the use of an item of property and equipment beyond its originally assessed standard of performance, the expenditures are capitalized as additional costs of property and equipment. The cost of replacing a component of an item of property and equipment is recognized if it is probable that the future economic benefits embodied within the component will flow to the Company, and its cost can be measured reliably. The carrying amount of the replaced component is derecognized.

When significant parts of an item of property and equipment have different useful lives, these are accounted for as separate items (major components) of property and equipment.

Depreciation and amortization are calculated on a straight-line basis over the following estimated useful lives of the property and equipment:

The estimated useful lives and depreciation and amortization method are reviewed at each reporting date to ensure that these are consistent with the expected pattern of economic benefits from items of property and equipment.

When assets are retired or otherwise disposed of, the cost and the related accumulated depreciation, amortization and any impairment in value are removed from the accounts. Any resulting gain or loss is recognized in profit or loss.

(f) Impairment of Non-Financial Assets

The carrying amounts of the Company's nonfinancial assets are reviewed at each reporting date to determine if there is any indication of impairment. If any such indication exists, the asset's recoverable amount is estimated.

The recoverable amount of an asset is the greater of its value in use and fair value less costs to sell. Value in use is the present value of future cash flows expected to be derived from an asset while fair value less cost to sell is the amount obtainable from the sale of an asset in an arm's length transaction between knowledgeable and willing parties less costs of disposal. In assessing value in use, the estimated future cash flows are discounted to their present values using a pre-tax discount rate that reflects current market assessments of the time value of money and the risks

to the asset. Any impairment loss is recognized in profit or loss if the carrying amount exceeds ecoverable amount.

Impairment losses recognized in prior periods are assessed at each reporting date for any indications that the loss has decreased or no longer exists. An impairment loss is reversed if there has been a change in the estimates used to determine the recoverable amount.

An impairment loss is reversed only to the extent that the asset's carrying amount does not exceed the carrying amount that would have been determined (net of depreciation and amortization) had no impairment loss been recognized.

(g) Equity

Capital Stock. Capital stock is measured at par value for all shares issued and subscribed.

Retained Earnings. Retained earnings represent the cumulative balance of net income or loss, net of any dividend declaration. Unappropriated retained earnings pertain to the unrestricted portion available for dividend declaration, net of stock issuance costs. Appropriated retained earnings pertain to the restricted portion which is intended for expansion projects.

Dividend Distribution. Dividend distribution to the stockholders is recognized as a liability and deducted from equity in the year in which the dividends are approved for declaration by the BOD.

(h) Revenue Recognition

Revenue is recognized to the extent that it is probable that the economic benefits will flow to the Company and the amount of revenue can be measured reliably. Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable, taking into account contractually defined terms of payment and excluding taxes or duties.

The Company is acting as a principal in all of its revenue arrangements.

The Company recognizes its revenues as follows:

Sales. Sales revenue is recognized upon the full rendition and acceptance of the services by the customer.

Interest Income. Interest income is recognized in profit or loss based on the prevailing bank deposit rates as it accrues, net of final tax.

(i) Cost and Expense Recognition

Costs and expenses are recognized in profit or loss when a decrease in future economic benefit related to a decrease in an asset or an increase of a liability has arisen that can be measured reliably.

- 1. Cost of Services Sold is recognized as expense when the related services are rendered to and accepted by customers.
- 2. Operating Expenses. Operating expenses constitute costs of administering the business and costs incurred to sell and market the goods. These are recognized in profit or loss as incurred.

(j) Operating Lease

Leases which do not transfer to the Company substantially all the risks and rewards of ownership of the asset are classified as operating lease. Operating lease payments are recognized as an expense in profit or loss on a straight-line basis, unless payments are structured to increase in line with expected general inflation or another systematic basis which is a better representative of the time pattern of the user's benefit.

Laxes

- 1. Current Income Tax. Current tax assets and liabilities are measured at the amount expected to be recovered from or paid to the tax authority. The tax rates and tax laws used to compute the amount are those that have been enacted or substantively enacted at the reporting date.
- 2. Deferred Income Tax. Deferred tax is provided on all temporary differences at the reporting date between the tax bases of assets and liabilities and their carrying amounts for financial reporting purposes.

Deferred tax liabilities are recognized for all taxable temporary differences. Deferred tax assets are recognized for all deductible temporary differences to the extent that it is probable that sufficient future taxable profits will be available against which the deductible temporary differences can be utilized. Deferred tax, however, is not recognized when it arises from the initial recognition of an asset or liability in a transaction that is not a business combination and, at the time of the transaction, affects neither the accounting profit nor taxable profit or loss.

The carrying amount of deferred tax assets is reviewed at each reporting date and reduced to the extent that it is no longer probable that sufficient taxable profit will be available to allow all or part of the deferred tax asset to be utilized. Unrecognized deferred tax assets are reassessed at each reporting date and are recognized to the extent that it has become probable that future taxable profit will allow the deferred tax assets to be recovered.

Deferred tax assets and liabilities are measured at the tax rates that are expected to apply to the period when the asset is realized or the liability is settled, based on tax rates and tax laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted at the reporting date.

Deferred tax assets and liabilities are offset, if a legally enforceable right exists to ser off current tax assets against current tax liabilities and the deferred taxes relate to the same taxable entity and the same taxation authority.

- 3. <u>Input Value-Added Tax (VAT)</u>. Revenue, expenses, and assets are generally recognized net of the amount of VAT. The net amount of VAT payable to the taxation authority is included as part of "Trade and other payables" account in the statement of financial position.
- 4. <u>Deferred Input VAT</u>. Deferred input VAT pertains to the input VAT on purchases of capital goods with an aggregate acquisition cost in each of the calendar month exceeding 1,000,000 that are claimed as credit against output VAT over 60 months or the estimated useful lives of capital goods, whichever is shorter.
- 5. <u>Deferred Output VAT</u>. Output VAT pertains to the output VAT on uncollected sales receivables. As a Service Company, the company recognizes and remitted VAT at the time of the collection of the trade receivables and not at the time of billing the services rendered. Output tax on trade receivables are deferred until the same are collected. Upon collection of trade receivables, the company issues the related Official Receipts and the related deferred output tax is subsequently reversed.

(l) Related Party Transactions

Parties are considered to be related if one party has the ability, directly or indirectly, to control the other party or exercise significant influence over the other party in making financial and operating decisions. Parties are also considered to be related if they are subject to common control. Related parties maybe or corporate entities. Transactions between related parties are accounted for at arm's-length prices or on terms similar to those offered to non-related parties in an economically comparable market.

rovisions

Provisions are recognized when the Company has a present obligation (legal or constructive) as a result of a past event, it is probable that an outflow of resources embodying economic benefits will be required to settle the obligation, and a reliable estimate can be made of the amount of the obligation. If the effect of the time value of money is material, provisions are discounted using a current pre-tax rate that reflects current market assessment of the time value of money and, where appropriate, the risks specific to the liability. Where discounting is used, the increase in the provision due to the passage of time is recognized as an interest expense.

(n) Contingencies

Contingencies are not recognized in the financial statements. These are disclosed unless the possibility of an outflow of resources embodying economic benefits is remote. Contingent assets are not recognized in the financial statements but are disclosed in the notes to financial statements when an inflow of economic benefits is probable.

(o) Events After the Financial Reporting Year

Events after the reporting year that provide additional information about the Company's financial position at reporting date (adjusting events) are reflected in the financial statements. Events after the reporting year that are not adjusting events are disclosed in the notes to the financial statements when material.

3. Significant Judgment, Accounting Estimates, and Assumptions

The judgment, estimates, and assumptions used in the financial statements are based upon management's evaluation of relevant facts and circumstances as at the reporting date of the financial statements. While the Company believes that the assumptions are reasonable and appropriate, significant differences in the actual experience or significant changes in the assumptions may materially affect the estimated amounts. Actual results could differ from such estimates. The judgment, estimates, and underlying assumptions are reviewed on an on-going basis. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognized in the period in which the estimate is revised and in any future periods affected.

(a) Judgment

1. Determining the Classification of Lease Commitment. The Company, as a lessee, has operating lease agreements for its office space and branch sites. The Company has determined that the risks and rewards of ownership related to the leased properties are retained by the lessor. Accordingly, the leases are accounted for as operating leases.

(b) Estimates and Assumptions

1. Assessing Impairment of Trade and Other Receivables. The Company reviews its trade and other receivables at each reporting date to assess whether objective evidence of impairment exists and to measure the amount of impairment loss that is required to be recognized in profit or loss. Management uses historical loss experience for assets with similar credit risk characteristics when estimating future cash flows and probable losses both on an individual credit basis and for the portfolio as a whole. The methodology and assumptions used for estimating both the amount and timing of future cash flows are reviewed regularly to reduce any differences between loss estimates and actual loss experience.

Impairment of Inventories. The Company determines if the estimated selling price less costs to implete and sell the inventories becomes lower than its cost due to damage, physical deterioration, obsolescence, changes in price levels, or other causes.

3. Estimating Useful Lives of Property and Equipment. The Company estimates the useful lives of property and equipment based on the period over which the assets are expected to be available for use and are updated if expectations differ from previous estimates due to physical wear and tear, technical and commercial obsolescence. The estimated useful lives and depreciation methods are reviewed periodically to ensure that these are consistent with the expected pattern of economic benefits from individual items of property and equipment.

There were no changes in the estimated useful lives of the Company's property and equipment during the subject year and the immediate preceding year.

4. Assessing Impairment of Nonfinancial Assets. Assessing nonfinancial assets for impairment includes considering certain indicators of impairment such as significant changes in asset usage, significant decline in market value, obsolescence, or physical damage of an asset. If such indicators are present and where the carrying amount of the asset exceeds its recoverable amount, the asset is considered impaired and is written down to its recoverable amount.

No impairment loss on nonlinancial assets was recognized by the Company during the current year and the immediate earlier year.

5. Retirement Benefit Expense. The Company accrues minimum retirement benefit liability in accordance with Republic Act (R.A.) No. 7641, "Retirement Pay Law," which requires a company to pay minimum retirement benefits to employees who retire after reaching the mandatory retirement age of 65 years old or the optional retirement age of 60 years old with at least five (5) years of service to the Company.

Due to undue cost or effort to use the projected unit credit method to measure its obligation and cost under the defined benefit plans, the Company ignores the following:

- estimated future salary increases (i.e., assume current salaries continue until current employees are expected to begin receiving post-employment benefits);
- future service of current employees (i.e., assume closure of the plan for existing as well as any new employees); and
- possible in-service mortality of current employees between the reporting date and the date employees are expected to begin receiving post-employment benefits (i.e., assume all current employees will receive the post-employment benefits).

Retirement benefit costs, which consist of current service cost and past service cost on the defined benefit obligation, are recognized in the statements of comprehensive income in the period in which they arise.

6. Assessing Realizability of Deferred Tax Assets. The Company reviews the carrying amounts of deferred tax assets at each reporting date and reduces the balance to the extent that it is no longer probable that sufficient taxable profits will be available to allow all or part of the deferred tax assets to be utilized.

1. INTRODUCTION

A. Authorization

In compliance with the bidding requirements, we are submitting the general security plan for DICT Luzon Cluster 1 (La Union and Pangasinan) and DICT Luzon Cluster 2 (Aurora and Nueva Ecija).

II. NAME AND MISSION OF INSTALLATION

The Department of Information and Communication Technology (DICT) shall be the primary policy, planning, coordinating, implementing and administrative entity of the Executive Branch of the government that will plan, develop and promote the national ICT development agenda (RA10844).

III. ASSESSMENT

Most of the installations are located strategically in the provinces of La Union, Pangasinan, Aurora, and Nueva Ecija. It was identified that these installations are located in an industrial and residential zone.

A comprehensive security plan will be submitted after a security survey is conducted in all areas mentioned above.

We will provide the number of security personnel that will be required in each installation equipped with long firearm such as a 12-gauge shotgun, communications equipment such as cellular phone and 2-way radio and CCTV camera, if needed. Alarm system will be installed and to be utilized in case of emergencies. A sensor lighting system will also be installed.

IV. PHYSICAL SECURITY

A. Barriers

We will conduct assessment on the present condition in the perimeter fence.

We will submit the proper recommendation based on the security standards to ensure the highest level of safety and security on each installation after a security survey was conducted.

B. Lighting Fixtures

Lighting fixtures inside and outside the building/s should be adequate enough.

Lighting fixtures must be maintained and checked periodically to ensure proper illumination of the area.

C. Personnel Access and Control

Visitors, deliveries and the like will be verified first with their contact person before given access into the premises. The same will be required to fill up in the visitor's logbook / log sheet and ask him/her to leave a valid ID with the guard on duty before entering the premises.

Only those with authorization given by the Management may be allowed access into the perimeter. In the absence of authorization, the said person should not be allowed or given access into the premises.

D. Vehicle Access and Control

All vehicles entering the premises should be controlled by the security personnel seeing to it that only those duly authorized are given access into the premises.

Vehicles should be parked only on designated areas to avoid traffic congestion.

E. Special Response Team

A special training will be conducted to security personnel assigned in each area depending on the particular requirements of the installation like life support techniques and methods and to include basic fire fighting course.

F. Coordination with Friendly Forces

We will maintain a close coordination with the barangay officials, Bureau of Fire Protection and police/military within the area of responsibility to ensure assistance when the need arises.


